GYMKHANA IN AID OF M.D.A.

ON Sunday, February 15, Mr. K. Bacher's farm, in the Roodepoort district, was the venue of another successful gymkhana and Jumping Competition—the first took place in September, 1940—held in aid of Magen David Adom funds.

A number of non-Jewish riders took part in the events, and among the many interested spectators were Brigadier J. B. Kriegler, O.B.E., and Mrs. Kriegler, who presented the various trophies and cups won during the day.

Major Kriegler, who was introduced by Mr. K. Bacher, the organiser of the meeting, appealed for public support of the Magen David Adom which, he said, rendered succour to all sections of the population in Palestine.

James W. Welterweig Crown

THE record crowd of 18,000 attended the White City Club's premier boxing attraction at Wembley, last Saturday night. Certainly got their full money's worth. During that memorable night, James W. Welterweig saw South Africa's boxing ideal in the biggest triumph of his professional career by gaining a decision against the redoubtable heavyweights champion, Olek, thus paving the way for him at the British Empire heavyweight title. They also saw another South African boxer, Alf Janfast, a clear-cut victory against Angelo for the national welterweight title.

James was most gallant throughout, and except for a few moments, had the better of his opponent most of the time. He scored with both hands, and at times attempted a knock-out, which was evident, however, that Angelo was a skilful fighter to please the crowd in this fashion.

Maurice Quezman, the middleweight from France, was a very disappointed man judging the manner in which he was losing his head when he was the loser on points in his battle with Don Carr. Like Carr, when the two met, the verdict was rather unpopular, and many present felt that a draw would have been a better decision. Since a rival in this country Quezman had only one victory, namely, against Bradley, but it is unlikely that a series of defeats will keep him out of the ring.

APPOINTED KING'S COUNSEL

Congratulations are being extended to Mr. I. A. Maisels and Mr. Arthur Suzman, members of the Johannesburg Bar, who have been appointed King's Counsel.

Mr. Maisels has taken a prominent part in communal affairs for many years past. He is Vice-President (Transvaal) of the S.A. Jewish Board of Deputies, having been elected to the Executive of that body in 1935. He is also President of the United Hebrew Congregation.

Mr. Maisels was on active service during the war and was discharged with the rank of major in the S.A.A.F. in October 1944, having been commended for valuable services.

Mr. Suzman took a prominent part in the affairs of the Witwatersrand University, and is honorary general secretary of the recently formed General Council of the Bar of South Africa.

During the war Mr. Suzman served as an infantry officer with the Rand University Infantry Corps and later represented the Director of Demobilisation before the War Pensions Inquiry Committee.
