Mr. Yellin said that the fact that the Israeli military leaders encouraged concerts in the midst of war indicates what an important part the orchestra plays in the life of Israel in peace-time as well as during the war.

Zionist Youth Council Strengthens Its Activities

DURING the last few months the S.A. Zionist Youth Council carried out a large volume of organisational and cultural work, and Zionist Youth activity throughout the Union of South Africa and Rhodesia has progressed steadily.

Adv. Harold Stutzen, the chairman of the S.A. Zionist Youth Council, when interviewed by a correspondent of the "Zionist Record," praised the manner in which all parties and movements affiliated to the Youth Council were co-operating. South Africa was the only country in the world where all Zionist Youth movements were affiliated to a central national council; and notwithstanding party differences there were numerous grounds upon which all movements could, and did, work together amicably to the advantage of their own movements as well as the common cause.

Cultural Publications

The Youth Council places great importance on cultural work, and a number of cultural publications had been prepared and were now being distributed among Zionist Youth. These include a short geography of Israel, illustrated with coloured maps, a booklet dealing with the military campaigns of Moses and Joshua, and a number of plays and poems for Chanukah. A few months ago a booklet entitled "Fighting Poems From Fighting Israel" was published by the Youth Council. During 1949 the Youth Council will issue publications regularly and will endeavour to keep up with the demand from Zionist Youth for cultural material.

Junior Youth

The Junior Youth Sub-committee, under the chairmanship of Mr. Louis Krokin, has been functioning very well and is preparing a number of items for the coming year.

Chalutz Sub-committee

The Chalutz Sub-committee has been functioning well and there has been co-operation from all the movements serving on it. The chairman, Mr. Sam Rubinstein, of Hahonim, who was the chairman during the last three months, did excellent work in binding this committee into a solid working body. Mr. E. Gastwirth of Hapoel Hamizrachi, is the present chairman, and is continuing the good work.

Zionist Youth Camps

All the movements affiliated to the Youth Council have, as in previous years, organised camps at the coast and the Young Israel Camp, organised on a non-party basis by the Cape Zionist Youth Executive, is also being held. The Transvaal Zionist Youth Executive is holding a camp over the Christmas week-end at Vereeniging. The popularity of these camps is proved by the large numbers who are attending them. Each movement has arranged a cultural programme of real value.

Organisation

The Organisation Sub-committee, under the chairmanship of Mr. Nat Lee, will, early in 1949, undertake an organisational programme covering the whole of Southern Africa.

Israeli United Appeal

Under the national convener'ship of Mr. Z. Dunsky, an energetic drive for the Israeli United Appeal has taken place. Youth in all parts have responded excellently, and it is anticipated that the Youth Campaign, which will be completed early in 1949, will be an outstanding success.
