Scripture: (of ~~the~~) 2 Cor. 5 vs 16-21 (New English Bible)  
Texts: 2 Cor. 5 vs. 18

1. There is a special reason why we worship ~~the~~ Sunday since this Sunday the way we believe we do. The memory of 16 June 1976 + what happened in Soweto on that day <sup>and the consequences it has for the whole S.A.</sup> will always ~~be~~ be the <sup>in the central message + few of Christ's words</sup> reason we the ~~is~~ as nation

2. There is another reason why we are conducting our worship service <sup>this morning</sup> the way we are doing: Many countries of churches in S.A. as well as in the world ~~are~~ are struggling to find answers to the issue of reconciliation & healing of their nation. But I'm not aware that in any other country in such a unique way on such a broad level so many agencies (govt., TRC, churches & many faiths, human rights orgs) are ~~so~~ so deeply involved as we <sup>are experiencing</sup> are in S.A. (govt. ---)

3. But is this the deepest reason why we as S.A. churches are so involved? Because of June 16? Because of hearings of the TRC + what we see <sup>esp.</sup> about them & Sunday evenings on TV?

If this is the <sup>real</sup> reason for our interest & involvement <sup>(2)</sup> then there is something serious lacking in our <sup>and of Christ</sup> faith & our understanding of the Gospel. ~~the~~  
~~on hand~~: his birth, his ministry, his sufferings, <sup>In the central message + few of Christ's words</sup> his crucifixion, his resurrection <sup>of Christ's words</sup> ~~behind~~  
Paul wishes to convey & explain to us in the passage of Scripture we have read: 2 Cor. 5:16-21: God has sent his Son, i.e., to be the reconciling person (the mediator) & force between God & man. That was the central message of his whole ministry: be reconciled to God! (to 20: "we implore you: be reconciled to God!")

This is the glorious truth of the Gospel, of the life, the ministry, the death & the resurrection of Christ: he reconciled to God!

But what we ~~have~~ constantly have to remember is that the <sup>main</sup> ~~the~~ test of reconciliation, the concrete <sup>of his reconciliation</sup> proof of our strengh ~~of his reconciliation~~ is to be reconciled to every brother & sister, every neighbour, every person from whom we have become alienated or estranged - whomever he or she may be!

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Hatred

<sup>also here</sup>  
Some another truth which we have to remember  
is that lasting healing is only possible if  
we have been willing to be reconciled!

We hear so much to-day <sup>where</sup> so many Saints & Aps.  
confusion are talking about the healing  
of the nation. It is a beautiful phrase:  
h---. But do we For it reminds  
us of the healing of attitudes, of relations,  
of past ways. But do we realize that  
the only way in which the nation  
can be healed and its soul restored  
is through true reconciliation?

What does this <sup>summons</sup> appeal of Paul say to  
us as Christian in church, for S Aps?

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Fifthly: Politically we need to become reconciled  
— Does not imply that we all need to belong to  
one political party or have only one pol. opinion —  
Secondly: Economically <sup>among rechristened places in our</sup> gap between rich & poor  
esp. when they are the most --- white —

Thirdly: Culturally <sup>among us by</sup> "Rainbow nation" —  
languages, cultures, customs, traditions

Fourthly: Morally + Spiritually: Most difficult  
task — challenge to the Church

Fifthly: Personally: Call to every individual:  
anybody you need to be reconciled to?  
— Your husband, wife?  
— Your father, mother?  
— Your son, daughter?  
— Your family or friend?

The go, act, be reconciled if you  
wile to be healed!
