Senior bestuurder by IT se betrokkenheid by Willie Davidse Bekabeling bevaagteken

US ondersoek beweerde korruksie by IT

Die Universiteit Stellenbosch (US) het 'n ondersoek geloods in verband met bewerings dat senior bestuurder van 'n afdeling Informasie Tegnologie (IT), wie se identiteit aan *Die Matie* bekend is, na bewering betrokke is by moontlike korruksie wat met die onderneming Willie Davidse Bekabeling verband hou.

Mnr Mohamed Shaikh, senior direkteur: Kommunikasie en Skakeling, het bevestig "dat daar 'n ondersoek aan die gang is na beweerd optrede of prakteke wat moontlik strydig is met die reëls en/of voorstelte van die universiteit".

Shaikh het ook bevestig dat die ondersoek in 'n gevorderde stadium is.

"Indien die volledige ondersoek daadwerklike wanprakteke bevind, sal die universiteit kragtens sy disiplinêre kode vir personeel op die verdere hantering van die saak en die gepaste bestraffende optrede besluit."

Die Matie het van 'n anonieme bron inligting oor die beweerde korruksie ontvang.

Die bron beweer die senior bestuurder het 'n onderneming in Willie Davidse se naam gestig, naamlik Willie Davidse Bekabeling.

Willie Davidse is die eienaar van dié onderneming.

Die senior bestuurder verseker

dan na bewering dat Willie Davidse Bekabeling kontrakte van die US ontvang.

"...daar [is] 'n ondersoek aan die gang na beweerd optrede of prakteke wat moontlik strydig is met die reëls..."

Die bron beweer dat die senior bestuurder tekenregte vir die onderneming het, maar Davidse self nie.

Willie Davidse Bekabeling het aan die begin van 2010 netwerkinstalering by Academia behartig.

Die bron beweer ook die moontlikheid bestaan dat indien die senior bestuurder nie Willie Davidse Bekabeling geregistreer het of bestuur nie, hy finansieel bevoordeel word indien hy kontrakte aan Davidse toeken. Davidse ontken bogenoemde aantygs.

"Dis onmoontlik. [Ek en die senior bestuurder] werk nie in 'n vennootskap nie. Hy werk nie vir my nie en ek werk nie vir hom nie. Almal by IT weet ek doen goeie werk."

Davidse sê mense het hierdie gerugte al aan hom genoem. Hy bevestig ook dat hy naamlose oproepe aangaande dié saak ontvang het.

"Dis nie dat iemand bevoordeel is nie. Alles by die universiteit het regverdig verloop. Ek verdien my geld eerlik."

Davidse het by die universiteit vir drie kontrakte gekwoteer, waarvan hy twee ontvang het.

"Ek het maar min gequote, want ek moet my manne aan die werk hou."

Die senior bestuurder het verkies om nie op die aantygs kommentaar te lewer nie, "sodat die universiteit die geleenthed gegun word om deur sy prosesse te gaan voordat [hy] kommentaar lewer".

Die Matie se bron het verduidelik dat IT in die verlede self netwerk-instalering en bekabeling behartig het, maar "toe is almal rondgeskuif en daarna het Willie Davidse Bekabeling ontstaan, met die senior bestuurder in 'n raadgewende hoedanigheid".

Human Rights courses offered

STELLENBOSCH University (SU) has launched a Unit for Human Rights Mainstreaming and Capacity Building.

The launch took place at Wallenberg Research Centre at the Stellenbosch Institute for Advanced Study (STIAS) on Friday 19 March.

The unit is a partnership between SU, the Western Cape provincial government, and the Human Rights department of the premier.

According to prof Amanda Gouws, lecturer: Political Science and head of the unit, the broad

aim is to focus on the interests and needs of marginalised groups such as women, disabled people and people living with HIV/Aids, among others.

"Government also identified this as a need and is in support of courses like this," Gouws said.

The unit aims to increase the amount of representation of these and other marginalised groups in provincial government. The unit is located within the Centre for International and Comparative Politics in SU's department of Political Science.

Die bron meen ook dat die senior bestuurder 'n ander onderneming, *Educables*, besit wat hy uit sy garage bedryf. Die bron meen dit kan verdag wees, aangesien Davidse ook kabels aan die US verskaf. Die bron voeg ook by dat personeel artikels soos multiproppe, kabels en routers by Davidse koop. In die verlede het die

senior bestuurder ook kabels na die IT-kantore gebring wat dan kontant aan studente verkoop is sonder om aan hulle kwotansies te verskaf.

Volgens die US se Finansiële Beleid vereis die Aankoop en Tenderbeleid en -Procedure, dat "die nie-verklaring van verwantskappe/belange en van die ontvangs van geskenke in 'n baie ernstige lig gesien [word] en kan [dit] tot dissiplinêre optrede teen personeel en/of ongeldigverklaring van 'n tenderproses en/of opskorting van 'n verskaffingskontrak lei."

Erica-vrouekoshuis was in werkelikhed die winners van die hokkie-toernooi.

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

SRC leaders from state universities attend conference

Building campus diversity

Student leaders from universities across South Africa recently attended a youth leadership training and cultural diversity conference facilitated by the Desmond Tutu Diversity Trust.

The conference took place in Centurion between 19 and 22 March and was aimed at bringing student leaders together to develop leadership skills in different contexts and also help develop trans-cultural leadership capabilities.

According to the Desmond Tutu Diversity Trust CEO, Gerrie Lubbe, a recent incident of physical confrontation and conflict on a university campus highlighted the need for a conference of this nature.

"Conflicts on our university campuses are, to a certain extent, a result of the nature of the cross-cultural diversity on the campuses and of our [complex] history," Lubbe said.

The two aims of the conference were to discuss the ideas of leadership and diversity on campuses and in society. Dr Danny Titus, from the Human Rights Commission, and other

leaders in business were invited to speak to the student leaders on these issues.

Lubbe said that the conference, which invited student leaders from all of the twenty-three state universities as well as the Monash University, is the first of its kind in the country.

"Student Representative Council (SRC) leaders have never met on a national level to discuss these issues. It gave them the opportunity to share and exchange ideas, which was very empowering," Lubbe said.

Nadia Marais, SRC member: Unity and Dialogue, says she found the conference "extremely enlightening".

"It was good to engage with student leaders from other universities and campuses and hear their opinions and thoughts on issues," Marais said.

She added that there were many different opinions, but that student leaders were also able to find consensus and collaboration.

"Students were encouraged to design and establish different projects on their campuses that would carry on the message of diversity and cross-cultural leadership," Lubbe said.

According to Marais, the SRC Unity and Dialogue portfolio is

working closely with the Unit for Multiculturalism and Diversity on various projects.

"Post-conference, some universities are collaborating on different projects and initiatives."

"In the Western Cape particularly we are looking at ways to work more closely together on these issues," Marais added.

As a follow-up project, Western Cape universities hope to engage in the Unity Festival taking place later this year.

"We are hoping to have universities participate in the festival, which will be held on National Heritage Day. The form of participation is not yet clear [but] we have met with the organising committee of the festival and plans are coming along," Marais said.

The Trust plans on visiting different campuses in six months to follow up on the initiatives and to run a similar conference again in a few years with new SRC members.

Delegates from twenty-one universities attended the conference, including Stellenbosch University, the University of Cape Town, North West University and the University of Pretoria.

US bied gratis programmeringkursus

SKOOLLEERDERS van nege skole in die Kaap en Boland het onlangs 'n Python-rekenaarprogrammeringkursus by die Universiteit Stellenbosch (US) bygewoon.

Dié inleidende kursus is gesamentlik deur die US se Departement van Wiskundige Wetenskappe se rekenaarafdeling en die Universiteit van Kaapstad (UK) se Algoritme-Vereniging aangebied.

Die kursus is gratis aangebied vir skoolleerders van Graad 8 tot 11 met geen agtergrondkennis of ervaring van rekenaarprogrammering nie.

Dr Steve Kroon: US rekenaarwetenskapdoseent, verduidelik dat die Python-rekenaarprogrammeringkursus 'n gewilde onderwysmiddel is omdat dit bekend is vir die "relatief maklik verstaanbare programmeertaal."

Lesings oor die Python-rekenaarprogrammeringkursus het oor drie dae gestrek. Die lesings is op beide die UK-kampus en die US-kampus aangebied. Die leerders het die lesings wat by die UK-kampus aangebied is, deur middel van lewendige internetuitsendings by die US gevolg. Assisteente van die US was ook betrokke by die aangebieding van die kursus om te help met die

leerders se persoonlike vrae.

Kroon verduidelik dat die kursus deel vorm van 'n inisiatief om belangstelling in rekenaarprogrammering op skoolvlak aan te wakker.

"Dit is nodig om meer personeel op te lei wat oor programmeringsprobleemoplossingsvaardighede beskik, ten einde tegnologiese vooruitgang in Suid-Afrika te bewerkstellig," het Kroon gesê.

Eben Dönges Hoërs, Belhar Hoërs, De Kuilen Hoërs en Belville Tegniese Skool het die opleiding bygewoon.

Ander skole sluit in Spine Road Hoërs, Settlers Hoërs, Islamia Kollege, Stellenbosch Hoërs en Strandfontein Sekondêr.

Aged piping infrastructure strained

Campus experiencing maintenance backlog – SU

Campus maintenance has been put in the spotlight following multiple pipe bursts in and around campus.

Burst pipes have recently been spotted in front of the Faculty of Arts, in the Neelsie student centre, along Victoria Street and in front of the JS Gericke Library, among other places.

A pipe burst in the Neelsie Sanlam Hall kitchen a few weeks before the end of the first term, and water seeped through the ceiling.

The water then ended up on the floor in front of the Post Office, which is situated on the ground floor of the student centre directly below the first floor kitchen.

These incidents led to questions being raised about the upkeep of maintenance on campus.

According to Mohamed Shaikh, senior director: Communication and Liaison, the university is currently suffering a maintenance backlog on campus.

Shaikh said that the university regards maintenance of its buildings and grounds as a top priority and noted that "plans are in place to source the necessary funds to catch up with the

backlog of deferred maintenance".

Shaikh said that the water spills due to burst pipes can be attributed to old piping systems.

"Unfortunately, a large number of the piping systems on campus have exceeded their life span, which has resulted in pipe bursts at times," Shaikh said.

"Due to limited funding, it is not currently possible to replace the whole piping network, but problem areas are identified and piping systems in these areas are replaced with larger pipes where necessary," Shaikh said.

Gushing water from a sprinkler system in front of the JS Gericke library caused the university some embarrassment when it caused a flood of muddy water to pool in front of the library's main entrance.

At the time, the library was hosting the welcoming function of the annual presidential meeting of the International Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA), of which ms Ellen Tise, director of the JS Gericke library, is the current president.

The presidential meeting ran concurrently with the annual library symposium.

According to mr Schalk Smit, head of finance: JS Gericke library, the surging water went on for "about three

or four hours" and led to a "very uncomfortable position".

"Unfortunately, when guests arrived there was a pool of muddy water in front of the entrance to the main building."

"Though it was river and not municipal water, it was still a bit of an embarrassment as guests didn't know [that it was river water]," he said.

An aged sprinkler system and faulty stop-valve were to blame for the overflow.

"[Because] the library is situated underground, puddles of water could seep through the walls and endanger the books," Smit added.

According to Shaikh, the inferior piping is not exclusive to Stellenbosch.

"The problem is not unique to the campus or to Stellenbosch, but rather a country-wide problem."

"Over the last 15 to 20 years, the university has experienced a phenomenal growth in student numbers, putting extra pressure on piping systems, especially with regard to sewage and the provision of fresh water," he added.

Shaikh said that Facilities Management and the Stellenbosch Municipality are closely monitoring the situation and will do remedial work when required.

Maties-Sokker deel van TB-veldtog

MATIES se eerste sokkerspan is op Maandag 15 Maart tydens 'n bewus-makingsgeleenthed by Kayamandi Hoërskool as TB-ambassadeurs vir 2010 aangewys.

Die aanwywing word saam met die Kick TB 2010-veldtog aangebied.

Hierdie projek is 'n gesamentlike inisiatief van die nasionale Gesondheidsdepartement en die Desmond Tutu TB-sentrum van die Universiteit Stellenbosch (US) se fakulteit Gesondheidswetenskappe.

Die Kayamandi-geleenthed was die voorloper van die nasionale veldtog wat op 26 Maart in die Sam Ntuli-Stadion in Gauteng geloods is.

Die projek is ook in Desember 2009 tydens 'n TB-kongres in Meksiko aan meer as 2 000 afgevaardigdes van verskeie lande bekendgestel.

Aanwysings is gegee oor hoe om die projek in die onderskeie lande te implementeer.

Ongeveer 250 000 sokkerballe met TB-simptome en -inligting daarop aangedui word nasionaal as deel van die veldtog versprei.

Mnr Garth le Roux, bestuurder: Maties-Sokker, het gesê dat die US se sokkerspan by sokker-ontwikkeling by skole in Kayamandi betrokke is.

"Alhoewel ons hierdie jaar in die euforie van die Wêreldbeker vasgevang is, besef ons egter dat die lewe oor veel meer as net sport gaan."

"[Ons] sal dus hierdie forum gebruik om 'n bewustheid vir TB in Kayamandi te skep en so probeer om 'n noemenswaardige verskil in die lewens van persone wat deur TB geaffekteer is, te maak."

Volgens me Wena Moelich, nasionale projekbestuurder van die Kick TB 2010-veldtog, het TB pandemiese afmetings begin aanneem en is die siekte- en sterfsterke ontstellend.

Moelich meen dat daar bykomend ook 'n groot stigma daarvan verbonden is om TB te hê.

"[Dit] is 'n massiewe probleem,

[maar] ons glo dat hierdie positiewe aanslag [rakende] TB die stigma 'n groot knou toedien."

"Dit is nodig omveral leerders bewus te maak van TB, maar op so 'n wyse dat dit 'n blywende impak sal maak."

"Hierdie sokkerballe gaan die boodskap huisbring. Leerders sien nou die TB-simptome en boodskappe op 'n cool sokkerbal – dit is fantasie," het sy gesê.

Op 'n vraag oor hoekom daar besluit is om sokker by die bewus-makingsveldtog te betrek, het Moelich geantwoord dat "sokker so 'n positiewe sport" is en dat amal sokkermal is in 2010.

"Ons 'kapitaliseer' op die passie rondom dié grootse internasionale geleenthed om ons gesondheidssokkerbaal te bring."

Die Desmond Tutu TB-sentrum vir Navorsing en Onderrig is deur die bekende Nobelpryswnner en oud-aartsbiskop, Desmond Tutu, geïnspireer.

Tutu is self 'n voormalige TB-lyer en is tans die beskermheer van die Tygerberg Kinderhospitaal.

Raadslede eersdaags bekendgemaak

raadslede nie bekendgemaak moes word nie, terwyl Aspeling gesê het Giliomee "gaan baie kreatief om met die waarheid".

Die US het by verdere navraag aangedui dat die verkiesingsproses bemoeilik en vertraag is deurdeut alumni se biografiese inligting op die Stellenbosch Stigting se databasis telkens foutief was.

Die Matie het in ons vorige uitgawe berig dat die verkiesing in omstrede gedompel is toe 'n vraelys oor die US se taalbeleid, wat aan alle oud-studente gestuur is, verkeerdelik aan vorige en huidige raadslede se name gekoppel is. Aspeling en die bekende taalvechter prof Hermann Giliomee was ook in die media in 'n woordstryd betrokke. Giliomee was van mening dat die sekondante van

THREE people from Stellenbosch University (SU) have been nominated for two South African Music Awards (SAMAs).

Mr Luis Magalhães and ms Nina Schumann, both lecturers in the SU music department, have been nominated for their CD *TwoPianists*.

Daniel Rowland and the SU Camerata (made up of SU students) have been nominated for their work on *Seasons of Vivaldi and Piazzolla*.

Both nominations are in the Best Popular Classical Music category consisting of five nominations in total. According to Schumann, who has won numerous awards in the past, including the SABC music prize, they are ecstatic about the nominations as both CDs were released by their company, TwoPianists.

"We only released two CDs last year and both are nominated. We have a 40% chance of winning in the category," Schumann said.

The SAMA ceremonies take place on 16 and 17 April.

Overall programme successful, Prim Committee and monitors highlight some concerns

Welcoming Programme feedback discussed

The Welcoming Programme Committee recently met to discuss the feedback from the different components of the programme.

Prof Ludolph Botha, chair: Welcoming Programme Committee, met with members of the Student Representative Council (SRC), the Prim Committee and the Remember and Give (RAG) committee, among other representatives.

According to Botha, many inputs and feedback, dealing with the execution of the welcoming programme of 2010, were tabled at the meeting.

"This is the one meeting where just about every facet of the university is represented."

"The feedback comes from [among others] every faculty, the RAG committee, the registrar, the students and the SRC," he said.

Botha said there was "nothing new" in the feedback and that the programme as a whole had been fairly successful.

Time spent on RAG-related activities during the welcoming week was highlighted as a concern, but Botha said that this had been reported in past

years and had also been investigated by the university.

"We've heard from HKs that they would rather prefer to do one of either Vensters or Floats, as it takes up an inordinate amount of time from the first year students in terms of practice and preparation," Botha said.

This year, three different recommendations from the report of the task team were added.

Other recommendations, which

include recommendations regarding activities such as Vensters and Floats, are currently with university management.

"There are no radical recommendations; the focus is more to negotiate with students and faculties to find a compromise in order to align the activities in a more balanced way," Botha said.

The first recommendation that was instituted was a combined meeting with all students, including PSO students, their parents and student leaders held at the Danie Craven Stadium during

the welcoming week.

In the past, this meeting was divided into four sessions that took place at the DF Malan Centre and the Kruiskerk.

An additional meeting was also required with parents and took place at the Kruiskerk.

Botha says that the combined gathering at the stadium, which was attended by about 8 000 people, was very successful and helped save time during an already packed welcoming week.

The second new addition to the programme was the cluster day initiative which was run by the different residence and PSO clusters.

Each cluster organised different activities and sessions to help integrate first year students into life on campus.

The final addition to the programme was PSO meetings with PSO students and parents.

According to Botha, all of the additions will probably be carried on in future welcoming programmes.

The rest of the recommendations from the task team report are currently with the university management.

Botha says that these recommendations, if accepted, will (along with the feedback from this year's programme which is currently being compiled) influence the planning for next year's welcoming programme.

Monitor's report highlights:

IN HIS report, head monitor Kobus Ehlers echoed the overall success of the welcoming programme. Ehlers stressed, however, that better integration between the various components is needed.

The monitor's report also noted that "it would appear that the RAG committee does not uphold the values of the Welcoming Programme" and that the committee is being excluded from the planning of the goals of

the programme.

"As a result, the RAG committee institute rules and regulations without correct consultation and inclusion of the value-driven system of the university," the report said.

The report went on to register a concern with the funds being spent on RAG-related activities in "comparison with the funds raised [by these events] and spent on community activities".

Prim Committee feedback:

FEEDBACK from the Prim Committee noted that some prims found aspects of the Alpha Programme to be unorganised and repetitive.

In the report, Jan Greyling, chair: Prim Committee, says that RAG and residence activities should be integrated more effectively with the Alpha Programme and that this would lead to greater benefit for first year students.

The report stressed that the Alpha Programme should be formulated to be more relevant to students. Another concern is that first year students are repeatedly requesting that expectations and concerns regarding their specific courses be addressed.

The report concluded that the overall feedback from the Prim Committee regarding the programme is positive.

SU hosts convention

STELLENBOSCH University (SU) recently hosted the African Convention of the Global Sustainable Bioenergy (GSB) project.

The three-day event, which took place between 17 and 19 March, forms part of a series of five conventions held around the world.

The Cape Town leg constitutes phase one of the project aimed at addressing unique issues and challenges faced by different continents.

The GSB project is a global initiative providing clear-cut guidelines, strategies and policies on the feasibility of large-scale sustainable bioenergy production around the world.

Prof Emile van Zyl, lecturer in the department of Microbiology at SU, was one of the organisers of the event.

"[The convention] provided a platform for stakeholders and scientific experts on the continent to actively discuss and plan together around the future of biofuels in an African context," Van Zyl said.

The convention focused on how the bioenergy sector can be used to address the problems hampering the African continent. It sought sustainable solutions to problems such as poverty, food security, health and energy security, among other issues. A Bioenergy Resolution for Africa was

also drawn up at the convention.

The resolution outlined ways in which bioenergy can be used to find solutions to the problems that the continent faces.

The draft resolution notes that global sustainability requires a sustainable Africa.

It goes on to highlight actions needed to ensure that Africa benefits along the full value chain of bioenergy supply and use.

These include, among others, more analysis and consensus on the potential of bioenergy, easier accessible information platforms using contemporary IT and mapping technology and African scalable demonstration projects that make use of the latest technology and local raw materials.


The draft is currently open for comments from the various stakeholders and participants.

After input has been received, the resolution will be ratified by the GSB project. The resolution will then feed into the larger GSB project.

The Bioenergy Resolution for Africa states that the continent has as much geographical potential as any other continent to produce plant biomass.

This biomass far exceeds the requirements for food and basic needs for the African population.

According to the resolution bioenergy is one of the most cost-effective solutions for a global sustainable low carbon energy future.

aan die media bekendgemaak.


Shaikh het gemeld dat Ikeys ondersteuners se lae bywoningsyf by wedstryde ook 'n invloed op die besluit gehad het.

Eight tonnes of garbage recycled

Recycling project links community

A recycling project between Horizon House, a home for mentally challenged adults, and the majority of Stellenbosch University (SU) residences has encouraged the recycling of over eight tonnes of garbage.

The project is encouraging the Stellenbosch community to focus on recycling by organizing SU campus residences to collect waste, which is sent to Horizon House where it is recycled by the residents.

The project kicked off on campus during the first week of February this year.

The project was initiated by Student Representative Council's (SRC) Matthew Haden, whose serves as the project coordinator and director. Piek Grobbelaar is the project manager. The initiative is sponsored by Steinhoff International while Wasteplan contributes by picking up the recyclables. Haden stresses that the project is important as the benefits of recycling are not realized in South Africa. "We are on the verge of a global crisis," Haden emphasises.

Horizon House, where inhabitants

have been recycling their waste for seven years, contributes to the project as the residents sort through the various received recyclables, preparing them for pick-up by Wasteplan.

According to both Elza Bresler, the head of Horizon House, and Haden, the project not only encourages recycling, but also encourages those at Horizon House to contribute to the Stellenbosch community.

Furthermore, the SU residences are stimulated to be involved by competing against one another in an effort to determine which residence has been collecting the most waste designated for recycling purposes.

Bresler emphasises that the individuals at Horizon House who are sorting the recyclables are physically very capable of the work, which takes place in a relaxing and comfortable environment.

The project specifically contributes to a working relationship between the Stellenbosch community and the municipality, various social circles, churches, the students involved and the individuals at the Horizon House.

Haden considers the project to be about sustainability and he envisions it as "becoming the norm in SU residences and on campus".

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



Geen geraasklagtes sover ontvang ten spyte van konstruksie in biblioteek tydens studietye

Biblioteek ontwikkel tans nuwe Leersentrum

Die JS Gericke-Biblioteek is tans onder konstruksie as deel van die Universiteit Stellenbosch (US) se *Fast Forward>>* projekte, in verwantskap met die Oorhoofse Strategie Plan (OSP).

'n Leersentrum word beoog waar studente in 'n gemaklike area kan studeer, reflekteer, groepbesprekings kan hou en navorsing kan doen. Die Leersentrum is deur Visser Kapperer de Bruin-Argekte ontwerp.

Volgens prof Russel Botman, visekanselier en rektor van die US, is die OSP-projekte in ooreenstemming met die breër universiteitsgemeenskap geloods ten einde teen 2015 sekere doelwitte te bereik wat die universiteite sal laat groei as uitstaande akademiese instellings te midde van 'n voortdurende veranderende internationale milieue.

Die doelwitte wil onder meer die tyd wat dit die gemiddelde voorgraadse student neem om hul graad te

voltooi halver, sowel as om die sukseskoers vir studente van 82% na 84% te verbeter en om die hoeveelheid studente wat die US sonder 'n kwalifikasie verlaat met 30% te verminder. Om hierdie doelwitte te bereik, moet studente se informasieletterheid opgeknap word.

Dit is waar die JS Gericke-Biblioteek se elektroniese navorsingsentrum en opleidingsfasilitete met werkspasie, internettoegang, gesprekskamers en multi-media-fasilitete 'n rol gaan speel, sê me Elbie van Wyk, koördineerder: Leersentrum.

Informasievaardighede word belangriker vir studente, meen Van Wyk. "Hierdie Leersentrum gaan soos 'n big brother wees wat studente help en verseker dat alle studente dieselfde geleenthede geniet," brei Van Wyk uit.

Die doel is om studente 'n verwelkomende en stimulerende omgewing te bied waar kennisgenerering ondersteun word, sowel as om studente se informasieprosesering en navorsingsuitsette te verbeter. Die beeld wat

geskep gaan word, dra by tot die idee van 'n soomlose biblioteek wat wêreldwyd toeganklik is: 'n tipe virtuele biblioteek.

Dit is belangrik om te beklemtoon dat hierdie Leersentrum nie 'n

Die doel is om studente 'n verwelkomende en stimulerende omgewing te bied waar kennisgenerering ondersteun word

Rekenaargebruikersarea (RGA) gaan wees nie, maar 'n area vir die ondersteuning en bemagtiging van die student, beklemtoon Van Wyk.

Dié projek word in twee fases beplan.

Fase een, wat tans onder konstruksie is, maak op die laer vlak van die biblioteek voorseening vir tegniese personeel wat verskuif gaan word van die boonstevlak na 'n Tegniese Sentrum met die nuutste tegnologie en

'n moderne voorkoms.

Fase twee sal die boonste gedeelte, links van die trappe, omskep in 'n area met 'n hulptoontbank, elektroniese klaskamer, besprekingskamers vir groepwerk, gespreksafskortings, informele sitplekke, multi-media-toerusting (soos plasma-televisekermes), Wi-Fi-internetkonneksies, drukwerk, skootrekenaargebruiksareas en verwysingsboeke.

Opgelide nagraadse studente en bibliotekpersoneel sal gedurende gewone biblioteek-ure beskikbaar wees vir hulp wat navorsing en tegniese kwessies betref. Hierdie Leersentrum sal slegs beskikbaar wees aan studente wat aan die US studeer.

"Die biblioteek het sover geen klages ontvang oor die moontlike steurings soos geraas wat die bouwerk aan fase een tans kan veroorsaak nie," noem Van Wyk. Me Stefané Franken, hoof: Roosters, is voor konstruksiewerk begin het genader om te verseker dat studente wat vir toetse studeer nie gestoor sal word nie. Daarom is daar 'n akoestiese

muur opgerig om die meeste geraas te blokkeer. Bouwerk wat geraas mag veroorsaak, word sover moontlik beperk tot vroegoggende en Saterdae. Verder sal geen konstruksiewerk gedurende die komende eksamentyd plaasvind nie en die oorskakelings tussen die twee fases sal gedurende die wintervakansie plaasvind.

Daar word gepoog om die Leersentrum teen Oktober te voltooi en geen konstruksie sal gedurende die finale eksamen aan die einde van die jaar plaasvind nie. Die res van die biblioteek sal onveranderd bly. Die Leersentrum is aanvullend tot bestaande dienste.

Hierdie projek geniet die steun van die Akademiese Belangeraad (ABR). Volgens Matthew van der Walt, ABR-ondervorsitter, is die ABR opgewond oor die beplande Leersentrum.

Die konstruksiefase mag studente ontwrig, maar die biblioteek het die voldoende maatreëls getref om enige ongerief te beperk, sê Van der Walt.

Nog *Fast Forward>>* projekte gaan in die toekoms aangepak word.



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

Die feit dat 17% van dokters Suid-Afrika verlaat ná hulle gegradeer het, wek verdere kommer.

Volgens Sapa het Motlanthe by sy inhuldiging gesê dat tersiêre in-

stellings baie belangrik is in die produsering van 'n professionele, kreatiewe en geskoold werkersmag.

Hy meen universiteite speel 'n kritiese rol in die ontwikkeling van die land.

Motlanthe sê hy word bemoedig deur die hoeveelheid nuwe studente by die UV, wat by ongeveer 11 000 draai.

Lenings laat menige student in 'n penarie

DIE NATIONAL Students Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS) laat talle studente in 'n slechter posisie ná hulle studentelenings van dié skema ontvang het.

Volgens die *Cape Argus* gee hierdie skema studentelenings aan arm studente. Tog staak baie studente hul kursusse en sit hulle dan met skuld wat hulle nie kan afbetaal nie. 'n Panel is deur die Minister van Hoër Onderwys en Opleiding, Dr Blade Nzimande,

aangestel om die saak te ondersoek. Daar is gevind dat 70% van die studente wat lenings by die NSFAS het, nie hul kursusse kon hanteer nie en dus opskop.

Die paneel het voorgestel dat universiteite meer arm studente moet aanvaar en meer akademiese ondersteuning aan hierdie studente moet bied.

Daar is ook voorgestel dat universiteite aan baie arm studente gratis voorgraadse studies bied.

UJ ontwrig deur Sasco-protesaksies

STUDENTE het op 4 Maart ingange tot die Universiteit van Johannesburg (UJ) met brandende goedere geblokkeer.

Volgens Sapa is dit deur die South African Student Congress (Sasco) georganiseer.

Hulle het beloof om nege universiteite in die land toe te maak uit protes vir gratis opvoeding.

Studente het klippe en brandende artikels voor die ingange van die universiteit geplaas en voor

die universiteit getotoi-toi met die gevlo dat mense nie die gebou kon binnegaan nie. Sasco is ontevrede omdat president Jacob Zuma in sy staatsrede baie min aandag aan onderwys gegee het.

Lazola Ndamase, sekretaris-generaal: Sasco, sê dat meer as 135 000 studente nie universiteit kan bywoon nie omdat hulle dit nie kan bekostig nie. Die polisie het die studente met water uit waterkanne gespuit.

DUT en UniZulu sluit nie weens dreigemente

DIE UNIVERSITEIT van Zululand (UniZulu) en die Durban Universiteit van Tegnologie (DUT) gaan nie sluit nie.

Dit kom ná die South African Student Congress (Sasco) op 3 Maart in 'n persverklaring gesê het dat hulle beoog om nege Suid-Afrikaanse universiteite te sluit.

Volgens *The Mercury* het Sasco nege universiteite geïdentifiseer, en die UniZulu en DUT verskyn

albei op dié lys.

Sasco se KwaZulu-Natalse voorstitter, Sandile Phakathi, meen dit is futiel om met universiteite in gesprek te tree, siende dat die universiteite gaan weier om toe te maak. DUT en UniZulu het beide aan *The Mercury* genoem dat hulle nog nie deur Sasco genader is nie.

Die bestuur het gesê geskeduleerde akademiese aktiwiteite sal voortgaan soos beplan.

Min swart academici 'n probleem – Pityana

UNIVERSITEITE sukkeldoor die algemeen om swart studente te motiveer om as academici opgeleid te word.

Volgens mnr Barney Pityana, vise-kanselier: Universiteit van Suid-Afrika (UNISA), kniehalter dit transfromasie in hoër onderwys in Suid-Afrika.

Pityana is die voorsitter van die transformasie-strategiegroep van Hoër Onderwys Suid-Afrika.

Pretoria News berig op 24 Februarie Pityana meen daar word gesukkel om voorheen agtergeblewe studente in die akademiese sektor te bring, maar ook om hulle te motiveer om professors te word.

Hy skryf dit toe aan die instiusionele kultuur van verskillende universiteite wat sekere studente kan vervreem. Pityana beklemtoon verder dat baie swart studente sukkeld om by oorwegend wit uni-

versiteite in te skakel.

Prof Crain Soudien van die Universiteit van Kaapstad het ook gevind rassisme is steeds 'n probleem op kampusse landswyd.

Statistiek van die Departement van Hoër Onderwys wys dat slegs 12% van swart leerders aangaan om hul opvoeding aan tersiêre instellings voort te sit. Dit staan teenoor 54% van wit leerders wat verder studeer.

Prof Errol Tyobeka, voorstitter: Hoër Onderwys Suid-Afrika-raad, meen die probleem lê by die skoolsisteem, weens die feit dat dié sisteem leerders oplewer wat swak voorberei is vir tersiêre opvoeding.

Hy sien die groter betrokkenheid van ouers en die opleiding van meer wiskunde- en natuurwetenskaponderwysers as moontlike oplossings.

Jake White is as die nuwe afriger van Wilgenhof-manskoshuis se eerste rugbyspan aanvaar. Dit kom ná 'n groep oud-Wilgenhofstudente bekommern geraak het oor dié koshuis se rugby-uitslae in 2009.

Volgens dr Le Roux van der Westhuizen, inwonende hoof: Wilgenhof, het hierdie groep oud-studente Jake White genader om Wilgenhof se rugby te verbeter. Die oud-studente verkieks om anoniem te bly.

"Wilgenhoffers is trots op wat hulle doen en ná 2009 se mislukte rugbysisoen moes daar stappe geneem word om te verseker dat daar nie sommer weer só iets gebeur nie," het Ruan Daffue, prim: Wilgenhof, gesê. Wilgenhof het verlede jaar net vier uit elf wedstryde gewen.

Die aanwysing van 'n nuwe

afriger word deur die Stellenbosch-Rugby-Komitee gehanteer ná die huis-komitees besluit of hulle wil hê die huidige afriger moet aanbly.

Volgens Tertius Pelser, sportvoorsitter: Wilgenhof, word die afrigers deur fondse van oud-Wilgenhofstudente gefinansier. "Dit is 'n ongelooflike geleentheid en voorreg om deur Jake White afgerig te word," het Pelser gesê.

Hy meen dit is 'n goeie geleentheid vir studente om by White te leer. Van der Westhuizen sê dat dit 'n goeie verwikkeling vir Stellenbosch- en koshuisrugby is en dat dit aan studente 'n ander graad van blootstelling gee. "Dit gee aan die spelers 'n kans om Jake self te leer ken en te sien hoe hy dink."

Vanjaar is Danie Craven se honderdste verjaardagviering en volgens Pelser het Wilgenhof 'n ryk geskiedenis ten opsigte van Springbok rugby-afrigers. "[Danie Craven] was

self 'n Springbokrugby-afriger en ook een van die beste Springbok-spelers, indien nie die beste nie.

"Dit is 'n fantastiese manier om Danie Craven se honderdste bestaansjaar te herdenk deur Jake White as afriger te hê," meen Pelser.

Dit is egter nie die eerste keer wat 'n koshuis rugby-afrigers van internasionale kaliber aanstel nie. Dawie Snyman en Brendan Venter het al voorheen onderskeidelik Helderberg en Simonsberg afgerig. Beide Snyman en Venter was voormalige Springbokrugbyspelers.

Van der Westhuizen sê hulle weet nie of die nuwe seisoen suskesvol sal wees nie, maar vir baie studente is White 'n rolmodel. Pelser sê: "Ons wil net rugby speel en dit geniet."

"Daar is nou 'n geleentheid geskep wat van só 'n aard is dat dit nie net 'n ongelooflike leerervaring is nie, maar ons ook weer in staat stel om ons rugby ten volle te kan geniet."

AS A student in social science, it is the norm to observe with extra care how the perplexing social world around you plays itself out. As such, I make my contribution from a social science perspective.

The term graffiti traces its derivation from the Italian word *graffiare* which means "to scratch". Graffiti has become a general term that is used to describe all writing, symbols, pictures or markings on the walls of public buildings.

Studies have been conducted to determine the reason why people resort to writing on toilet walls.

Studies have pointed out that male toilet graffiti can be split into four categories, namely homosexual, heterosexual, non-sexual and racist.

I have realized that toilet 305 on the second floor of the Arts building also has its own graffiti. The writing

To cut a long story short, the graffiti of toilet 305 says a lot of things. The fact that these few insignificant racist chauvinists opted to write on toilet walls and not in classrooms or on the street is worthy of analysis.

In our midst, there are still remnants of racist tendencies from the crucibles of apartheid tendencies. In their own consciousness, they know that racism has no place in modern day existence and that no one really wants to be associated with racism.

These characters know they are doing something wrong, which they are not proud of, hence their anonymity.

Be that as it may, it is paramount that we recognize the fact that unprogressive tendencies have no place in modern day society and when the history is written one day, such tendencies will always form part of the dark pages. I am assuming that none of us aspire to be part of the dark pages.

Possible wineland-mining worries students

THE STATE-OWNED African Exploration Mining and Finance Company (AEMFC) has received criticism from numerous groups for their application to mine tin, zinc, lead, lithium copper, manganese and silver on farms in and around Stellenbosch and in the Durbanville area.

In a press release, Mputumi Damane, AEMFC chair, said that the company decided to withdraw its application to prospect in the Western Cape "for strategic business reasons".

According to the *Mail and Guardian* of 26 March 2010, "it emerged this week that [AEMFC] has not withdrawn its application to prospect on the Boontjes Rivier farm in Worcester. [...] The battle for the winelands is long from over". AEMFC applied to mine in more than 1 000 areas nationwide.

One of the farms which would have been affected by the possible mining is the Jordan Wine Estate. This estate, together with other farms and legal officials, is running the Winelands Action Group, which is at the forefront of protests against AEMFC.

Robyn Martin from Jordan Wine Estate encourages students to get involved. "Join our Facebook page (Stop Mining our Winelands). If we make enough noise as a community, maybe legislation can be changed."

Die Matie asked three student organisations to comment on what students can do to support this fight.

EcoMaties Sustainability Society

The proposed mining activity in the Cape Winelands will have various profound impacts on the people, character, environment and economy of the region.

Firstly, as a group advocating sustainability and environmental protection, EcoMaties Sustainability Society is gravely concerned about the impact mining activities will have on the environment.

The area concerned forms part of the Cape Floral Kingdom and contains some of the most threatened and rarest vegetation types in South Africa – namely granite renosterveld.

The process to declare the Cape Winelands a UNESCO World Heritage Site will be completely impeded by mining in the area. Furthermore, the impact of mining on the scenic beauty, water and air quality in the area cannot really be mitigated as such impacts are inherent to mining.

Secondly, we are concerned about the impact mining would have on the wine tourism of the area. When the area is mined, wine estates will have to close, resulting in hundreds of job losses of farm workers as well as people employed in the tourism and hospitality industries. Mining is inherently not a sustainable activity.

The long-term socio-economic consequences of the application were not evaluated and the business procedures followed in the rights application process by the African Exploration Mining and Finance Corporation (AEMFC) were unethical.

News24 stated that AEMFC was not even aware of the wine-farming in the prospecting geographic area.

The relationship between the region's wine farming, floral species, tourism and economic opportunities cannot be ignored.

Some 90% of South Africa's wine is produced in the Western Cape, a demarcated World Heritage Site and home to the world's smallest yet most diverse plant kingdom – the Cape Floral kingdom, with more than 10 000 plant species occurring in a region of 90 000 km². 70% of the species are found nowhere else on earth.

The wine sector which employs more than 275 000 individuals also plays a critical role in the economic stability of our province. The wine industry's annual contribution to the national Gross Domestic Product (GDP) rose to R26,2 billion in 2008.

A macro-economic study of the wine industry undertaken in December 2009 by the Conningarth Economists found that for every R1 million invested in the wine

industry, 5,5 jobs are created. The equivalent figure for mining is only 3,4 jobs per R1 million.

In a long-term perspective the mining activities may have damaged the ground resources so badly that it may have become unviable farming ground. Not to mention the destruction of our indigenous floral species.

The tourism sector, one of South Africa and the Western Cape's key economic contributors, will also be negatively affected by the mining.

Not only will there be a loss of job opportunities, fertile farming ground and indigenous plant species, but the mining may negatively impact the region's attractiveness to tourists as well.

According to Johan Malan, chair: Cape Winemakers Guild, the mining activities will damage South Africa's reputation in the international wine markets.

This will directly impact the tourism attractiveness in our region as well.

When considering all the long-term effects of the prospected mining rights, the sustainability of the wineland's economic infrastructure was undermined.

I find the application to be economically unviable.

Currently, there is a fight to handle such applications for mining rights on a national level. The Winelands Action Group calls for NGOs and local and international parties to get involved in these issues and make their voices heard. Environmental issues are the fight of our generation and we must take them on.

Finding alternative energy

THE CENTRE for Renewable and Sustainable Energy Studies (CRSES) at Stellenbosch University (SU) is conducting research on alternative energy sources such as biofuels and wind, solar and wave energy.

South Africa relies heavily on fossil fuels and as a result it is the world's 13th largest carbon emitter, although ranking only 32nd in terms of Gross Domestic Product (GDP), according to the World Bank. Clearly, alternative energy sources must be found.

According to the International Energy Agency (IEA), between 80 and 90 per cent of our energy is generated by burning fossil fuels like oil, coal and natural gas. The resultant emissions negatively affect human and environmental health, with carbon dioxide driving global climate change.

Biofuels derived from crops such as maize, sugar cane and palm oil have

been touted as a sustainable energy source, but in fact threaten food security and lead to the destruction of rain forests, as reported by Oxfam.

However, if biofuels can be produced on a large scale from lignocellulose – the building blocks of most plants – it will no longer be necessary to turn food crops into fuel or to plant vast palm oil plantations.

This is exactly what prof Emile van Zyl, Biofuels Research Chair at SU and his colleagues aim to do.

Wind power is gaining momentum in South Africa with the first commercial wind farm powering up in 2008 near Darling. Two larger wind farms are currently being developed at Jeffrey's Bay and Colesberg.

The CRSES has also undertaken a number of research projects on wind turbine generator systems.

Current research by the Department of Mechanical and Mechatronic Engineering at SU also concerns solar energy.

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Aficionado Avocado

APRIL has nearly arrived, bringing with it a selection of cute bunnies, delectable chocolate eggs and a long Easter weekend.

In this week leading up to the Easter weekend, I always find myself immersed in an assortment of these treats scattered across my room. Too much to eat, is what I'd say, not that I mind the chocolate, but there are only so many ways to bite into an easter egg.

So I have found a very easy and practical use for the generous helping of chocolate that does the rounds during Easter, and it goes down well after a lazy autumn picnic with hamburgers near the hangbrug or some other practical picnic spot.

This is a great recipe because not only do burgers taste amazing and keep well, but they are an ingenious way of using chicken fillets, which can be found in abundance at most supermarkets.

If, however, you find yourself in Stellenbosch and not at home for Easter, don't fret; invite a couple of friends over and celebrate with your own home-made feast. So let's assume you are catering for a party of eight.

Firstly, buy a packet of four large, well-cut and deboned chicken breasts. Also get eight or so freshly baked buns – you can try Kaizer roles for variation but hamburger buns will do just fine – and a purple (Spanish) onion, lettuce, some sweet basil, a large well-ripened tomato, avocado, white cheddar and your favourite mayonnaise-based sauce. The secret to this recipe is that it works out to be cheaper the more burgers you make, so maybe extend your guest list and include a few unfamiliar faces stranded at your

residence.

The next step: Cut the chicken breasts in half down the side by placing your hand on the breast and holding the knife at a 180 degree angle, so that you have two fillets that are the same size and shape, just thinner by half in width.

These you score slightly: Take a sharp knife and cut criss-cross patterns on both sides of the chicken by first cutting a few lines in one direction, and then repeating this at a 90 degree angle.

Now to build your burger: Mash the avocado and use it instead of butter to smear the bun-halves, which not only tastes great and is healthy, but helps the lettuce stick. Then a slice of lettuce and some mayonnaise-based sauce. An idea for a good sauce is mixing some mayo with sweet chilli sauce. Next add a half-scored chicken breast, a thick slice of white cheddar, a slice of tomato and salt and black pepper to taste, some diced basil leaves, and another lettuce leaf. Place the other bun half on the top of your completed stash and voilà, a burger.

When you return from your picnic, tummy full, you suddenly realise you have all those chocolate eggs and bunny rabbits staring at you. So pour some milk into a pot, place it on the stove, and heat it up (but don't let it boil). Break your chocolate into pieces and stir until melted. Pour into a mug and enjoy this welcome warm drink when the cooler autumn winds start blowing.

If you would like any further information on this Stellenbosch superstar, he advises you to have a look at his Facebook page J'Something.



Profile-browsing innocent fun or a growing obsession?

Facebook-stalking a reality

Facebook, the social networking website that allows one to communicate and exchange information with friends.

This technical explanation does not adequately explain what Facebook is or the appeal it has to millions of users worldwide. Today, Facebook is more than a mere website; it is a virtual recreation of real life, where lives and actual emotions are accessible to anyone with a curious eye.

We live in an age where we want to know every detail about people's lives. This is evident from the amount of reality shows created in recent years, and the thousands of tabloid magazines that make millions from exploiting the lives of others. And this phenomenon seems to be growing. We no longer only obsess about the lives of celebrities, but also about the lives of our friends.

Facebook is any stalker's dream. As a user, you are able to monitor and keep tabs on the interests, travels, dramas, heartaches and relationships of crushes, exes, friends and enemies alike. We've all done it.

Yes, it includes the guy you've got a crush on, whose status updates and pictures you may or may not check daily. And those wall-to-wall posts between your ex-girlfriend and

the "new guy" you can't help but read. And those cute guys you met at Bohemia, whose profiles you check the moment you get home at 02:00. Although you wouldn't stand outside someone's house during the early hours of the morning with binoculars, we all peek into our so-called friends' lives in the virtual world.

The danger lies in the fact that we are putting our friends under the same scrutiny as the celebrities we obsess over. Privacy has become a foreign term in the cyber world. And this, in itself, is a danger.

Furthermore, according to a source from the Department of Psychology, Facebook poses a greater risk to young children and adolescents. The source goes on to say that there are millions of sexual predators who use networking services such as Facebook to find victims that can be easily misled by their manipulative methods.

Lisa (not her real name), a third-year BAcc student, shares her experience of a Facebook stalker early last year.

"This guy added me as a friend and I simply accepted because I thought that he looked cute on his profile picture. I didn't know him and there weren't many details on his profile, but I thought nothing of it."

"Then, a few days after we became friends, he started sending me messages and writing on my wall."

"The messages were very sweet at first: many compliments about my photos. Then it became weird. He would send disgusting sexual messages which made me feel uncomfortable."

"I told him to stop and that I was going to report him, but he simply said it's my own fault for putting up 'tempting' photos of myself. I immediately deleted him. Since that incident, I don't accept anyone as my friends if I don't know them."

Another worrying issue is that photos that are uploaded to your account can be accessed and used by your so-called "friends". It is fairly easy to view someone's profile, go to their photos and download the images you desire.

This gives predators the freedom to abuse uploaded pictures by downloading them and using them without the owner's knowledge.

It becomes disconcerting when you consider that at any given moment, anyone in the world could be viewing your profile, recording your contact information, reading your wall posts and scrutinising your photos; even learning details that you may find insignificant, like your likes and dislikes.

It is then that the apparently harmless activity of constantly observing certain individuals' Facebook pages becomes less thrilling, as it dawns on you that they might be doing the same to you.

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Practice your poker face



Generic tent designs are easily confused, so to avoid embarrassment (by sleeping in a stranger's tent), try to differentiate your own accommodation from the similar ones around you.






spot for the next few days? Well, cheap accommoda-tion is easily secured in the form of a tent.

What You Can Do for Your Vision to Make Learning and Earning Easier

Headaches, squinting, eyes that burn, ache, water or tire easily are indications that your visual system needs help.

Nearly everyone is born with the potential for good eyes and sight.

Vision, however, is learned. And, the way you use and care for your visual system directly affects your enjoyment of play, school or work.

Your visual system can undergo tremendous stress these days. Students now read three times the number of textbooks their grandparents did. Adults constantly use their near vision at work and play. The shift to computers has engaged a growing number of workers in prolonged, near-vision tasks.

Eye discomfort, headaches, blurred vision, lowered visual performance - a wide array of vision-linked problems - are related to this heavy nearpoint vision load.

The problem is that human beings were not designed to do constant seeing less than arm's length away. We have hunter-soldier eyes for survival, spotting game and enemies at a distance. Only in the last half century have so many people been forced to deal with sustained, near visual tasks. The result has been a constant stress on the visual system, producing symptoms and eye problems.

Many vision and eye problems are the direct result of an adaptation (or failure to adapt) to these relatively new, near-centered visual tasks.

It's no wonder that ignoring good visual hygiene, the impact of long-term visual stress, or failing to heed symptoms of vision problems can have such a significant effect on the quality and enjoyment of your life.

How to Take Better Care of Your Vision

Here are some basic guidelines for reducing visual stress:

Look up occasionally Children and adults need to look up and away from near tasks to distant objects regularly.



A BOARD, SLANTED 20 MAKES READING EASIER

Lighting Illumination on what you are doing should be three times brighter than the rest of the room. Don't read under a single lamp in a dark room. Eliminating glare is especially important for closeup work. Mixing fluorescent and incandescent light is good.



Best distance Reading, writing or closeup work is best done at an eye-to-activity distance equal to the length between middle knuckle and elbow (14 to 16 inches for adults).

Sit straight Have chest up, shoulders back and weight over the seat so both eyes are at the eye-task and at an equal distance from what is being seen.

Reclining posture Sit upright while reading or watching television in bed. Avoid lying on back, side or stomach.

Writing Hold your pencil or pen an inch or so from the tip so you can see and guide it without tilting your head or body to the side.

Writing position The hand you write with determines the angle at which the paper should be held.



Television Should be viewed from a distance equal to seven times the width of the screen (about 8-10 feet), and while sitting upright. Have indirect lamps on in the room, but placed to eliminate glare on the screen. Watching television involves and develops very few visual skills and should be limited to a few hours or less daily, especially for children.

Participate Do outdoor activities that require seeing at distances. Become aware of what and where things are on all sides. When walking, keep your head up, eyes wide open and look toward, not staring at objects.

Visual discomfort while doing close tasks Appropriately prescribed nearpoint lenses can reduce discomfort while making learning, seeing and earning easier and more efficient. Behavioral optometrists, in their evaluation of your visual needs, will consider the conditions in which you work, play or study in their evaluation of your visual needs. If visual discomfort is present during nearpoint activities, consult a behavioral optometrist.



Die Seerowers met Gees

Vir diegene wat groot ondersteuners van plaaslike musiektaal is, het De Plate Kompanjie al sinoniem geraak met 'n aand uit in Bohemia. Hulle is egter nie net die krels (en dame) wat sorg dat ons ore tintel van lekkerte en ons kele nat bly nie. *Die Matie* het 'n bietjie met Bertie Coetzee oor De Plate Kompanjie gesels en gehoor hoe hulle die wêreld 'n beter plek vir kuiergeesdriftiges maak.

Wat presies doen De Plate Kompanjie en doen julle dit in Nederlands?

DPK spesialiseer in *events*, ons tree op as agente vir *venues*, *bands* en *brands*. Deur dit probeer ons mense, musiek en mal idees op unieke maniere bymekaarbring. Ons doen dit nie in Nederlands nie; die naam is gebaseer op ons destydse verslavning aan toere en ons het onself gesien as ontdekkingsreisigers in 'n vreemde en grotendeels onbekende industrie. Plate is 'n woordspeling op *records* en die feit dat DPK uit Zinkplate gebore is.

Hoe het julle besluit om DPK op die been te bring?

Die baie natuurlik en sonder 'n groot getob gebeur. Ek en Beer het

besluit die industrie kort iemand wat onself en die goeie *bands* om ons ondersteun en geleenthede gee. Ek het geld by my ouma geërf in daardie tyd en daarvan het ons Die Helde, Foto Na Dans, The Orange Stilettos en heelwat ander se songs opgeneem vir die kompilasie-album "Die Eerste Avontuur". So is Die Eerste Avontuur ook per ongeluk gebore.

Was dit 'n moeilike besluit?

Dit was lekker, maar moeilike tye en ons het heelwat dinge reg gedoen en baie dinge verkeerd gedoen. In die begin dae het ons telkemale met ons koppe in die muur vasgehardloop omdat ons oorgretig was om als en almal wat lekker *tunes* maak te ondersteun. Deesdae doen ons heelwel minder dinge, maar ons fokus hard op dit wat ons wel aanpak. Dit was dus nie 'n moeilike besluit nie, want ons het nie regtig gedink nie, maar soos *cowboys* ingejaag.

Jy en Beer Adriaanse speel en skryf tussendeur ook vir Zinkplate. Verg dit nie baie tyd en stres om beide aan die gang te hou nie.

Ja, ons is bevoordeel om in so 'n situasie te wees en dit hou ons besig! Ons [Zinkplate]-kamerade, Beitel en Basson, en [in DPK] Porra en Alette, maak dit vir ons moontlik om altwee te kan doen sonder om een te erg af-

te skeep. Hoe besiger 'n man is, hoe meer kry jy gedoen en ons probeer 'n lekker balans tussen al die dinge vind.

'n Belangrike deel van wat DPK doen is om jong bands met talent te identifiseer en hulle 'n fighting chance in die industrie te gee. Wat moet 'n band doen om julle te beïndruk?

Ja, dit was hoekom ons begin het en dit is vir ons belangrik om nuwe bands 'n kans te gee. Dit is egter moeilik omdat daar deesdae net so baie bands is en nie nooddwendig genoeg plekke en events waar hulle kans kan kry nie. Op die ou end soek *venues*, *promotors* en borge voete deur die deur en 'n band moet dus uniek genoeg wees, hard genoeg werk en 'n hype om hulself kan bou. Buitenhieroor sal ons steeds probeer om *bands* wie se musiek ons waardeer, in te druk op *line-ups*, al is dit nie nou wat die mense wil hoor nie, maar wat ons voel hulle moet hoor.

Wat is dit met die seerowering?

Die seerowers het ontstaan – nes DPK en die Avontoer – op Zinkplate en Die Helde se Weskustoer einde 2005. Ons het met 'n agt-ton trok teen die Weskus opgetoer, op die sand geslaap, *merch* geruil vir kos en Zinkplatwyn gebootleg by die

It's Complicated deur clichés gekniehalter

DAAR was daardie oomblik tydens die 76ste Oscar-seremonie in 2004 waar 'n mens weliswaar begin twyfel het of ons plaaslike gunsteling, Charlize Theron, sou wegstaan met Suid-Afrika se eerste goue beeldjie vir haar vertolkking van die reeksmoordenaar Aileen Wuornos in *Monster*.

Haar strafste opponent daardie aand was sonder twyfel die veteraan-akteur Diane Keaton, benoem vir haar rol in die skreeusnaaksie *Something's Gotta Give*.

Daardie film was iets nuuts, iets vars op die rak vir die romantici onder ons: 'n gesofistikeerde komedie dog ook 'n soetsappige liefdesverhaal – maar met 'n hart.

Sy sal te alle tye in 'n modieuze dog gemaklike uitrusting geklee wees en haar vel sal gloei en blink, ongeag haar ouderdom.

Die storielyn sal natuurlik rondom haar manewales gevorm word en vir haar soveel kanse moontlik gee om die kyker met oulike stuitighede te vermaak.

Kykers word tydelik met hartstogtelike geroer totdat die prent uitendelik uitgerek word tot die onafwendbare "and they lived happily ever after..."-uitkom.

Meryl Streep vertolk in dié geval die stereotipe hoofrol. Sy is 'n geskeide

ma van drie wat nuwe woema in haar lewe kry deur 'n verhouding met 'n getroude man (Alec Baldwin) aan te knoop.


Die vangplek is egter dat hierdie getroude man haar eie eks-man is wat haar etlike jare vantevore met sy huidige, veel jonger vrou verkul het!

Gooi tussenbeide die belangstelling van 'n ander geskeide man (bly iemand in Hollywood ooit getroud?) in die vorm van Steve Martin en jy kan gerus weet *It's Complicated* stuur af op elke moontlike cliché denkbaar in Hollywood.

Maar dié film is werklik ook nie gemaak vir die jonger generasie nie. Dit bly deurgaans daadwerklik bewus van sy ouderdom en dialoog soos "Your age is a big part of what I like about you" wys dat die skrywer 'n sekere mark in gedagte gehad het.

Top-notch shows on offer this year

AS A student with a demanding schedule and deadlines lurking around every new corner, one is often simply too besieged by the academic treadmill to appreciate the myriad of rich cultural experiences on offer.

The Drama Department also has a production showing at the Grahamstown Festival.

The play is *Woza Andries* (an alternative take on the famous play *Woza Albert* by Percy Mtwa, Mbongeni Ngema and Barney Simon) and will be directed by Christiaan Olwagen.

More than just a lecturer

Many of you may know dr Dawid de Villiers as a lecturer in the English Department. What most of his students don't know, however, is that he is also the frontman of Jeremiah Brimstone Band. They recently released a full-length album, *From the Wrong Side of the River*. *Die Matie* asked De Villiers a couple of questions about his hobby.

Jeremiah Brimstone Band has been around for a while now. How was the band formed and where did the name come from?

The first version of the band was formed in Stellenbosch around 1999, when I was still a postgraduate student. Hendré Retief, our percussionist, was already involved back then. I was looking for a name that would capture a particular mood, something that would accommodate the blues, country, the carnivalesque, as well as Old-Testamental fire-and-brimstone rhetoric within its sphere of implication.

Many of the songs deal with those irrational impulses and desires that drive us as human beings and sometimes – in extreme cases – come to define us. It's about the shadowy side of life, and that is what the name of the band is meant to evoke.

At any rate, the band played here and there, but the whole thing was quite intermittent, and we disbanded in 2002. I went to Taiwan for almost two years. After my return, Hendré introduced me to Heine du Toit. His

band, amaBhulu?, had broken up and he was looking for musicians to work with him and Elmi Badenhorst, who plays the accordion and harmonica. In early 2009, we were joined by Natalie Mason, a viola player from Birmingham.

Why did we have to wait so long for your first full-length album?

That's nice: the suggestion that someone was waiting. The answer to your question is, quite simply, that until fairly recently there wasn't really a band to speak of. When we reformed in 2006 it took us a while to get off the ground; I would say that it is primarily since Natalie's arrival on the scene last year that things started taking off. Once the decision was made to do a recording, the whole thing came together quite quickly. We launched the CD – *From the Wrong Side of the River* – at the end of last year. Alisa Farr, a former art student at SU, designed the cover.

Does your work in English literature influence your music and lyrics?

Without question. But not the academic, analytical side of the work; rather, it is the reading that impacts upon one's writing. All writers start out being readers – or music listeners, of course. It is usually quite evident to people who listen to us for the first time that my influences include people like Nick Cave & the Bad Seeds, Leonard Cohen and Johnny Cash. I might add other, more subterranean, influences – like Sonic Youth, Violent Femmes or Velvet Underground. I

should of course add that these are my influences; the great thing about working with a band is that the music I bring to the table as songwriter is significantly modified by the tastes, strengths and peculiarities of the other band members. And finally, the sound as a whole is shaped by the fact that we are performing it at this time and in this place.

Your genre (Alternative Folk) is very rare in South Africa. Is Jeremiah Brimstone Band planning to take the South African music industry by storm with your story-telling sounds?

I have no doubt that there are many people out there who will connect with what it is we're doing. Having said that, I don't think it likely that we'll cause a stir on a national level.

After all, when we identify our genre as "Alternative Folk," we are indicating that we consider our sound to fall outside the ready-made categories that the local music industry and, consequently, most consumers of local music, think in terms of.

The industry pours a lot of money into the business of priming people for certain products; I guess we're relying on the kind of people who take the trouble to look for something else.

This means that people interested in getting their hands on the CD are not likely to find it in the big music stores in the foreseeable future; they'll have to try the local independent music dealers. You can also order it via our website.

I'll be satisfied if the CD does well enough to merit another shot at recording.

Wrestlerish – *The Rude Mechanical*

WRESTLERISH is fronted by Werner Olckers, with Jacques du Plessis on bass and keys, Gavin Flaks on drums and David Grevler, also on bass.

All these guys – complete with scruffiness and flannel shirts – conjure up a mix of country, folk, indie and rock.

Their debut album, *The Rude Mechanical*, contains 13 smoothly produced tracks full of great lyrics and feel-good vibes.

The album contains some standout tracks, such as "Bad News". This track combines an upbeat rhythm with dynamic guitar riffs filled with Werner's smooth voice. If you need a song to skip to on your way to class, "Bad News" is just the thing.

The title track, "The Rude Mechanical", perhaps the simplest song of the album, with almost only an acoustic guitar throughout the song accompanied by Werner, is a test of the band's songwriting abilities and they succeed flawlessly. The song reminds me of City & Colour, an indie folk group from Canada. However obscure the

similarity, these bands are equally great.

"Oliver Tambourine", a potential radio hit, is another favourite on the album. Wrestlerish's mix of solemn acoustic riffs and tambourine echoes in "Oliver Tambourine" could almost be included in a Fleet Foxes album.

"An Interlude For Wolves" tones it down a bit with a slow rhythm and by showing off Olckers' bottom end.

Just when you think the album is getting stale, out comes "Maybe I Could", which has one of the best refrains on the album.

At first listen, the album felt lacking and some things bothered me, such as Olckers' tendency to do the same vocal twirl, but later it grew on me, and when you take into account the amazing production of clear guitars, smooth bass and distinct drums, you realize what a masterpiece this is for a local band.

South Africa no longer has to play second fiddle. The album hit the shelves just at the right time, because it's one of those albums you can listen to lying on the grass in autumn looking at clouds while leaves drop to ground.

Van Coke Kartel – *Skop, Skiet en Donner*

DIE DERDE Van Coke Kartel-album, die opvolg op *Waaksam en Wakker*, is anders. Met *Skop, Skiet en Donner* het hulle die tjello's vir synthesizers verruul.

Daar is nog steeds die skop-in-die-gat rock 'n roll vibes, maar die nuwe album is 'n mengelmoes van elektronika, covers en nuwe "ou" liedjies.

Nadat Van Coke Kartel hul eerste single van die album, "Voor Ons Stof Word", in Desember al vrygestel het, kon 'n mens dadelik hoor hier is iets anders aan die gang. Hierdie verandering was die byvoeging van Peach van Pletzen, die man agter Yesterday's Pupil. Peach het ook die produksie op *Skop, Skiet en Donner* gedoen. Sy invloede is duidelik hoorbaar.

"Voor Ons Stof Word", met staccato riffs, synths en acoustic guitar, is by verre my gunsteling Van Coke Kartel-liedjie tot nog toe: dit was vars. Dit het selfs nuwe aanhangers onder my vriende gekweek, maar ongelukkig het die album nie die meesterstuk volgehou nie.

Dit was 'n teleurstelling om te sien hoe min nuwe liedjies daar eintlik op die CD is. Van die dertien

liedjies is twee covers, en drie is nuwe "versions" van ou Van Coke Kartel-tunes. Dit is altyd goed om te sien hoe 'n band hul eie musiek herinterpretier, maar ekspirementasie met nuwe klanke sou beter gewees het.

Die nuwe liedjies is egter nie 'n teleurstelling nie. Die synth-klanke in "Ondier Kom!" en "Bitterpil" is net so welkom, maar in "Huissiek Gebede" was daar 'n nasmaak van iets bekend, en na verdere ondersoek het die bekende guitar riffs en stem van Laudo Liebenberg (aKing) gehlyk die oorsaak te wees.

"Skadu's Teen Die Muur" se donker note en acoustic aanslag stel die beste lirieke op die album voor. Die twee covers, "Maniac" en "Cocaine", sal goed live wees, maar vir luistermaterial voel dit 'n bietjie kort. Die gospel-version van "Ondersteuning Ongeweier" is 'n verrassing met orrel en al.

Die algemele produksie van die album is uitmuntend. Peach kan verskeen meer albums produseer.

Die album is die beste tot nog toe, maar hoe dit met hardcore Van Coke Kartel-aanhangers aanklink gaan vind is ander storie, veral met die elektroniese aanslag.

Ons sal ook nog moet sien hoe dit live klink.

"Dit het 'n hele nuwe wêreld vir my oopgemaak. Ons het voortdurend gerepoteer, opgetree en getoer," vertel sy entoesiasties.

Die Cutt Glas-fenomeen

Bondina is tesame met Karen Meiring die stigterslede van Cutt Glas, die acapella-groep wat al twintig jaar lank plaaslike en internasionale gehore vermaak. Die oorspronklike groep lede het tydens Richard Loring se 1990-produksie van Joseph and His Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat ontmoet.

"Die produksie het nege maande lank getoer, met die gevolg dat ons baie tyd saam in die bus spandeer het. Om die tyd om te kry, het ons maar gesing." Een van hul mede-akteurs in die produksie, Ian van Memerty, het hulle uitgedaag om vier liedjies in te oefen sodat hulle op sy televisieprogram Music à la Carte kon verskyn. Die res is natuurlik geskiedenis.

"Ons het van die begin af besluit dat geen enkele persoon groter as die groep moet wees nie. Twintig vroue was al deel van die groep, dus dink ek dat elke keer as 'n nuwe asem inkom, ons as groep bly vernuwe."

Sy sê die media bly hul grootste bron van inligting wanneer hulle aan 'n produksie se teks werk en hulle skroom nie om met enige bekende se (s)e(k)skapades die spot te dryf nie.

"Ons bewoerd van die verhoog af wat mense eintlik dink en daarom geniet hulle ons vertonings," verduidelik sy hul suksesresep. Bondina vertel dat elke produksie baie organies plaasvind. "Ons gee elke groep lid se idees 'n kans. Elke vrou het ook 'n ander sterke en daarom is ons ook so dinamies," vertel sy. Hulle het al die wêreld met hul vertonings deurkruis.

"Ons is baie gelukkig dat die gehore wêrdwyd mal is oor wat ons doen. Ons pas ook natuurlik die program aan vir die spesifieke land

waar ons optree. Queen, Billie Joel en Manga Groove se musiek bly gewilde keuses."

Cutt Glas het onlangs tydens die Woordfees hul twintigjaar-herdenking in die bedryf gevier met 'n optrede by die Oude Libertas Amfiteater, die plek waar hul eerste optrede ook plaasgevind het.

Ander verpligte

Bondina se grootste verantwoordelikheid is tans die direkteurskap en bestuur van die Oude Libertas Amfiteater.

"Die teater is vanjaar drie-en-dertig jaar oud en kry steeds duisende komplimente," sogg sy. Veral buitelandse toeriste is gerekende toeskouers by die vertonings en dit blyk dat die opleg-aspek dikwels die trekpleister is. Die teater funksioneer tans, as gevolg van die weer, slegs tussen November en Maart, maar Bondina het groot planne vir die toekoms.

"Ons wil 'n winterreeks in die restaurant-area begin, aangesien daar onlangs 'n verhoog aangebou is. Die area is natuurlik kleiner as die amfiteater en daarom sal die vertonings meer uit klein, intieme musiekvertonings bestaan," vertel sy met blink oë. Die planne sal egter eers volgende jaar in werkking tree.

Die Oude Libertas Amfiteater finansier ook elke jaar twee produksies wat op toer gaan. Die eerste is Händel's Messiah: A Capella. "Die idee van hierdie produksie is dat elke dorp of stad se koor gebruik word vir die produksie. Net die vokale ensemble-orkes bly behoue," verduidelik sy die konsep.

Die ander produksie wat die teater finansier is 'n produksie met Gloria Bosman, die Afrika Mamas en die Abaqondisi Brothers. "Hierdie vertoning is absoluut ideaal vir die sokkertydperk, want dit is verteenwoordigend van wat die buitelanders wil sien," sê Bondina.

Dan is sy ook die algemene bestuurder van Gigs Galaxy, 'n promosie-agentskap vir kunstenaars. Groot name soos die Afrika Mamas, Karen

Zoid en Jannie Moolman was al onder Bondina se vlerk.

"Ek was nog altyd baie selektief wanneer ek kunstenaars inneem om te bestuur, want ek wou aan almal genoeg tyd en moeite kon bestee." Gigs Galaxy is steeds op 'n baie klein skaal aan die gang en Cutt Glas val dan steeds vandag nog onder Bondina se sorg.

Die Suid-Afrikaanse musiekbedryf

"Afrikaans is gesond!" roep Bondina uit as die gesprek na die stand van die Suid-Afrikaanse musiekbedryf lei.

"Daar is 'n geweldige stimulus in Afrikaanse musiek, al is dit nie nooddwendig goeie musiek wat geskryf word nie," laat hoor sy. Sy maak dit duidelik dat die keuse op die ou end in die publiek se hande lê om te onderskei tussen goeie en slechte Afrikaanse musiek.

"Die proses om 'n album op te neem is deesdae gans te maklik en daarom ly die kwaliteit van menige Suid-Afrikaanse album daaronder," verduidelik sy.

Bondina sê dat Nataniël een van haar persoonlike ikone in die Suid-Afrikaanse musiekbedryf is.

Tyd vir ontspan is daar maar weinig, maar Bondina swem graag, stap met haar twee Labradors of span uit met 'n romantiese roman vol "kinkels en kabels". Bondina sê sy is verzek van 'n perfeksionis nie, maar sy het wel 'n kleintjie dood aan kunstenaars wat met jeans en t-shirts optree. Só sal jy hâár nooit op die verhoog (of op straat) aantref nie!

Upon further research, I stumbled upon the university's own Sustainable IT blog (<http://blogs.sun.ac.za/sustainableIT>) where this issue has been raised in the past. Of particular interest is a report on the "printing footprint" of the university. I would advise you and others to have a look at the startling findings that were made.

I admit that I may have committed a misinformed fallacy in saying that the trees used for making paper are a threatened commodity (which you kindly pointed out to be incorrect). Nevertheless, the issue at hand is one of overconsumption – and a dangerous impression your letter created, Mr Bester, is that there are no serious consequences of the careless overconsumption of paper.

The issue is best summarised in the following paragraph, which I quote from the Sustainable IT blog:

"In a country such as water-stressed South Africa where biodiverse, indigenous vegetation is under threat, the prospect of more paper plantations and bigger and more paper mills is a concern. And as one of the more carbon-intensive economies on the planet, our contribution to climate change should be of even more concern. Less printing is good."

You mentioned that you are currently studying Development and Environment. From your writing it doesn't seem as if you've grasped the concepts of responsibility and sustainability. Maybe you should consider also enrolling for a course in Ethics.

I am increasingly aggravated by the university's (mis)management of Computer User Areas (CUAs, or RGAs in Afrikaans). As I'm a BA student, I'm referring specifically to Humarga and a few of the problems that have really started to irk me over the past few months.

What is supposed to be an accessible working area for students, is nothing like that at all. The greatest problem I encounter is the actual availability of computers during the day. It seems that there are daily tests or practical classes taking place in Humarga, which take up a vast number of (if not all) computers. This leaves students with a seriously limited quantity of computers to use, and inevitably not everyone can do their work. This creates backlogs in both my, and other students', work.

Secondly, in the evening, when there are ample computers available and it's possible to work without interruption, provision is made to make it an utterly uncomfortable experience. Of particular note is the air conditioning which is switched off. Considering the heat we've experienced recently, it has been excruciating to work at these times. Apparently the A/C is shut down nightly to save costs, but I fear that the university will potentially suffer an even greater economic due to computers burning out from the heat as well.

As a student relying solely on CUA's for all electronic work, these matters are particularly bothersome. It would be really great if these bottlenecks could be examined and addressed – a solution would naturally only increase students' productivity.



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
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Kendo success for SU

STELLENBOSCH Kendoka was among the fighters who descended upon the Japanese School Hall in Emmarentia seeking the ultimate prize, the National Kendo Championship title.

The South African Kendo Federation's (SAKF) Open Championships was held on the last day of a two-day intensive seminar led by sensei's Buster Sefor (6th dan) and Tony Hughes (5th dan). The seminar was officially opened by Consul Hiroshi Jingu of the Embassy of Japan, who handed over 20 sets of bogu (armour) to the SAKF to help develop the sport of Kendo in South Africa.

A day of intensive training helped prepare the kendoka from across the country for the stiff competition they would face in the Open Championships. The largest national tournament of the year, male and female kendoka gave everything they had, but only the strongest made it through to the knockout rounds. There

are only a handful of legal strike points, namely the men (head), kote (wrist), do (side) and tsuki (throat). To score in kendo, one must attack the target area with ki-ken-tai-itchi, combining sword, body and spirit and true zanshin (awareness). The first competitor to score two points in the allotted time-frame wins.

Of the Stellenbosch Kendo Club (SKC) contingent that took part in the annual seminar, only Carle Joubert from Stellenbosch University and Janto Dreijer competed in the Open Competition. Both Dreijer and Joubert made it through the preliminary pool rounds, but were defeated in the knock-out rounds. SKC's Joubert, however, was not done as she went on to compete in the ladies championship.

The finals came down to the two national team members, Joubert and Joret Olivier of San Kawa Kendo Dojo. Olivier won the match to gain the title of ladies national champion. Both Olivier and Joubert will be traveling to Hungary in April alongside the mens' team for the European Kendo Federation's Championships.

weer in volle swang terug te keer.

Beckham is egter nie die Engelse afrigter, Fabio Capello, se enigste probleem nie. Wayne Rooney, wat deur baie mense as Engeland se eintlike ster-speler gesien word, het 'n beseerde knie wat nou weer probleme veroorsaak. Rooney het tydens die kwalifiserende wedstryde nege doele aangeteken. Engelse dagblaaie het berig dat Rooney, wat gereeld buite aksie is as gevoigd

van hierdie spesifieke besering, vir die volgende paar weke nie aan klubwedstryde sal deelneem nie.

Verder was daar ook sprake dat Manchester United se verdediger, Wes Brown, ook nie beskikbaar sal wees vir die Wêreldbeker nie as gevolg van 'n voetbesering. Ondersteuners is egter hoopvol dat hy binne ses weke sal herstel en homself dan in die oorblywende wedstryde sal kan bewys voordat
