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COLIN SHAMLEY came up to Johannesburg from Port Elizabeth in 1966...and stayed. He has made numerous non-commercial (limited editioned) recordings, mainly for the SAFMA (South African Folk Music Association.)

As was previously said, unlike any xxx performer/writer in the western world, his major outlet has not been thru Radio and record...but thru the news papers. COLIN still & 'packs them in', in Port Elizabeth, Cape Town (he broke a box-office record at the SPACE), Durban, Johanne sburg and Pretoria.

His songs however have been recorded by many commercial recording artists, used in films, (noteably KATRINA - the theme and title song) radio and more recentley in a TV documentary.

COLIN'S songs sound the best when they're coming from him.

Of late he has been appearing with his 2-man backing group, 8007. This is not the first time COLIN has been in a group - although he is 'known' as a solo performer, and many still prefer to hear him that way....but this is the first time this country has ever had a 'tight punchy' (almost Rock) trio, delivering melodies with sensible wax lyrics. Those who loved COLIN for his musical words, sometimes feel that the size of the sound is too overpowering for the lyrics. Personally I think they're not listening....and that many of GOLINS songs just need 'something' bigger than an aucoustic guitar. It's city country music.

That's not to say guitar fanatics (and there are countless 'Shamley' style guitarists in this country who've 'hitched' a thousand miles just to hear him play) won't be treated to his unusual incredible 2 finger *** style guitaring. SHAMLEY easily gets 700 rands worth of driving rhythme from his R600 American **** aucoustic Guitar** and he does his solo set.

The 'rapp' is also still there. SHAMLEY humowr.....! know people who only come to hear what he has to say, on stage. Unlike the theatricapro , COLIN, in true Troubadown tradition, can't simply switch or the smiles.....if he's got nothing to say...he sings!

He sand in a number of clubs, in New York's Greenwhich village, and in New Tersey. He doesn't say much about his few months in America.....but lots of Americans had some very good things to say about him.

COLIN is an accomplished, and rangue 'original' quintarist; he writes clever and melodic songs; he talks around and about those songs in a very funny way, and he performs them well.

Although he has done almost 4 months recording with a major local recording compray...the tapes have never left the studio. This time there are plans to go into a studio with his own group, 8007,....and this I believe that if any local song recording a great popular export,..it's bound to be one of COLIN'S.
