Des Lindberg record banned

"FOLK ON TREK," a long-playing record by last year's Sari Award winner, Des Lind-berg, and his wife, Dawn Sil-ver, has been banned, accord-ing to yesterday's Government Gazette Gazette.

The record, made in July, includes songs sung by the Eindbergs during their ninemonth South African platteland tour. Thousands of copies have been sold.

The banning has been con-demned by Johannesburg folk-singers, who said they were mystified by the action. Keith Blundell, a well-known

Johannesburg folksinger, said: "I am flabbergasted. I have heard the Lindbergs sing for some years and there is nothing in their material which war-

rants banning.
"This action is most disturb-

ing. I think the people who ban records in South Africa are influenced by overseas folksingers. They have gained a false impression of artists here.

Dave Marks, who has written a number of folksongs, said:
If think it is a great record. The Government's action is laughable and stupid.
Robert Solomon, who

manages folksingers, described the banning as "astounding." "The Lindbergs have sung the songs to packed houses in every dorp in South Africa." he said. "Everybody from six to 60 has loved them."

Mr Mathew Mann, a spokesman for the recording company which cut and distributed the disc, said he could see no reason why it should have been banned.
