Dear Arne

Attached are the lyrics. This file also contains the Zulu Chorus - which was not featured on the Nick Taylor recording in 1967. (A Zulu friend of mine translated them when we re-recorded this song with Ladysmith Black Mambazo & some other friends, many years later).

Some people are not aware that the Mountains of Men I am referring too, are what we used to call the Mine "dumps" or the Gold Dumps that surround Johannesburg & the Free State Gold Fields. (Most of them are Green now, not gold anymore) It's a simple song – I was 18 years old when I wrote it (underground) – as a dedication to all the miners I worked with & to my Grandfather who died while working on Crown Mines in the 1930's.
