IN THE SUMMERTIME: As the saying/song goes What goes round comes round......it's like me with MASTER JACK...after 27 years there's a revival in the song, soundtracks, ads and covers. SUMMERTIME is an alltime classic a 'time marker' for 2 generations the world over......BOB DYLAN! well, you couldn't get more accolades than that! That's wonderful. As DYLAN fanatic I can't wait to hear that version.

Although I understand the economics, I have always been against a 'precious' song that reminds me of a special time in my life popping up as an advertisement for some or other product. That to me is the worst thing in the world......now I hear that MASTER JACK may also be used for an ad. GRAHAM was so proud that VOLKSWAGEN used his TEACH YOUR CHILDREN for their South African ad campaign. We have to pay the rent, so I guess we can't really complain,....just an opinion!

To business: We keep 'missing' out on doing something with MUNGO JERRY/RAY DORSET in South Africa. I have 100 legit excuses. No sooner had I returned from the UK (when we met briefly) than my company (3rd Ear Music) changed course for the 4th time in so many years. I am only a 45% share-holder...after 25 years on my (doing sound-gigs to keep the label going) it's strange not to be totally independent and make my own decisions. However, as explained CLUB MUSIC DIRECT (the Mail Order company) are part of the same 'group' and they would like to get involved. As far as I know, ANDY BUNKER (CMD MD) did contact HAL CARTER re: re-issue your catalogue......I gave CMD/ANDY all the samples you sent me.

You have some real 'sleepers' here, not least of which is LET'S GET STARTED, FORGOTTEN LAND among many. CMD are strong on the point of trying to link catalogue sales with personal appearances/concerts. As you know we did very well with CROSBY, STILLS & NASH in January, but ofcourse we didn't have their CD's. Although STEPHEN promised us his new live solo recording......what an amazing album, and we may be doing MANFRED MANN'S EARTHBAND for a 'homecoming' tour in November. MANFRED hasn't played here at home in 36 years....although he does visit us often (every two years or so) when he's out seeing his mom in Johannesburg.

Let's see what we can do on a combined album/promo tour for mid 1997? Is this a possibility? Or would you come out solo (as we also discussed remember) and perhaps pick up a band? We did that in 1994 with Texan SHAWN PHILLIPS, and we sold out between 750 to 2,000 seaters in Johannesburg, PE & Cape Town. I will approach SUN CITY. We are already talking about my JAMES TAYLOR tour in Feb for the SUPERBOWL.

If you can give us times, dates, asking (guaranteed) fee and a rider (personal & technical) then I could get started. Can't promise, but I will put it to my people - if CMD can get your catalogue, then I am almost certain a tour would be possible.
