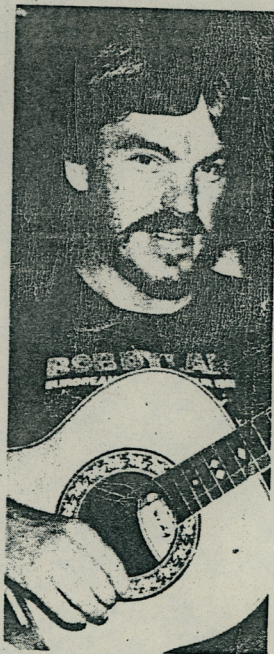

Laid-back Sunday harmony



GAVIN WEEKS, the Grand's resident musician, has teamed up with Mark Wilson from the Pig 'n Whistle to offer some laid-back harmony sounds on Sunday evenings.

The duo — using the unlikely-sounding name Dave's Not Home — will be appearing together at the Grand till the end of January.

They plan to team up permanently as a duo at the end of 1985 — the fact that both are fully booked up as solo artists till then has delayed the merger.

On Sunday evenings their sound changes from their usual week-night repertoires to a more folksy, Woodstock-type sound in the Crosby, Stills and Nash vein with the accent on vocal harmonies and a relaxing sound.

The pair swap guitars and Gavin also plays bass.

At the end of January, Gavin moves on to Springs and Mark will play at the Beacon Island Hotel in Plettenberg Bay.

The Sunday evening gig starts at 6pm and continues until 8.30. Entrance costs R3 — this includes light supper and a rock movie.
