Soprano & singing teacher in Johannesburg.

now in U.S.A. Pianist

GLASSER, Stanley (see p. 96) b. \* Febr. 1926 Johannesburg.  
Composer, pianist, lecturer in music

HALLIS, Adolph \* b. July 1896 Port Elizabeth

Concert pianist, music teacher and composer

HANSEN, Deirdre Doris \* b. 16 August 1938 in Pietermaritzburg,  
Transvaal. Ethnomusicologist.

Deirdre taught piano at Newcastle Academy until she entered for the B. Mus. degree at Rhodes University (1958-1961). Taught at Victoria Girls' High School (1962-1964), continued piano studies with Rupert Mayr & became piano teacher at Rhodes 1964. Concurrently she was a research assistant at the University's Institute of Social and Economic Research. Completed M.Mus. 1968. Then investigation on the influence of Western music on Composers of the Nguni people. After 1971, research into Xhosa-people. submitted 1981 to Wits. Univ. Ph.D. (D.Phil.). Is now S. Africa's leading authority on the music of the Cape Nguni & a prominent figure in S. African ethnomusicology. Has performed as soloist in concerts and programmes of the SABC.

# I DELSON, JEREMIAH (JERRY)

\* b. Dec. 1893 in Liepaya, Latvia.

Composer, conductor, viola player.

Partial to viola which he played since age of 14.

## A. Z. IDELSON

had spent a year in South Africa (1906), composed songs and choral pieces, and then moved on to America and Jerusalem, where most of his research and creative work was done. Jerry's sisters had also settled in Johannesburg, so in 1912 he came out to join them.

1916-1917 and again 1922-23 he played viola (C. Town orchestra) and studied with W.H. Bell (composition).

1923-26 was Musical Director for African Theatres a member of Chamber music ensembles in Joburg and Pretoria. Joined SABC as LIBRARIAN, PROGRAMME COMPILER & ORCHESTRATOR until 1946. Became Director of Music to the United Jewish Progressive congregations of Johannesburg.
