
Credit & Thanks



THE PROJECT There is still unprecedented interest in South African music from all over the world - yet much of our musical past like our political past is hard to access. Just as people & books were banned, certain popular music & musicians - who were perceived to be a threat to the old order - were also subject to banning & censorship. The Hidden Years Project is not just an exercise in Nostalgia - we're planning for the future by reflecting on the past & wrapping up the present - a rich hidden history

ON THE ROAD TO THE FESTIVAL – LSDI, DACST & 3rd EAR'S COMMITMENT TO DEVELOPMENT.


Over the past 2 months the Lubombo Spatial Development Initiative, in association with 3rd Ear Music & the Department of Arts Culture Science & Technology, have been involved with a series of Satellite Festivals & Training Workshops in Music, Dance & story telling. These training programmes & workshops have been held throughout the Maputaland region & many of the talented youngsters who were 'discovered' will be featured here, at the Greater St. Lucia Wetlands Festival of Living Treasures - And 'Living Treasures' they are.

The DACST groups, under the directorship of **Vusi Ndima**, include local trained Dance teams by Sifiso Mngomezulu in iNdlamu dance, **aBafana Bodumo**; Mrs Gugu Ngboese iSizingili girls **Izintombi Zendabuko** & a iSishameni boys dance group **aMa Mpansula**; Jabulani Buthelezi trained the iSicathamiya group, **iNgwavuma Hotline** & Ngwane Mphakanthini trained the wonderful iSizingili boys dance group, **aMathole aMnuama**.

Winners of the Satellite groups 'discovered' in the region by 3rd Ear Music's Christopher Faya, will be introduced on the main Festival stage. They include nDlamu Dancers, iNkunzi Emdaka from iNgwavuma & Khokh' uMoya & iSicathamiya group Abafana aBazenzayo from Manguze – Gospel groups from Manguze & iGwavuma include Ithemba & the Mosvold Gospel Choir & poet Ntombifuthi Nomandla from Mbazwana & from Ingwavuma master storyteller, Nondumiso Khanya.

The LSDI's Isiaih Mhlangu & Bronwyn James have brought a whole new meaning to the world of 'cultural tourism' – this is tourism with a difference. As part of the festival's development project, they have been busy assisting the local communities set up a series of Back-Packers' camps where local & international tourists can have a genuine KwaZulu Natal 'community & cultural' experience. 50 Bed & Breakfasts have been made available for this festival as well as a number of catering stalls where you can savour indigenous dishes & hospitality.

GITO BALOI (Mozambique)

Founder member of the popular South African Band, **Tananas** and widely acclaimed for his distinctive vocal and bass contribution, he has recently incorporated his broad Mozambican roots to the **African Gypsies** as well as in his diverse solo career. This unique collaboration with **Sergio Dias** and **Brice Wassy** enables him to explore his Portuguese connection from an African perspective.

BRICE WASSY (Cameroon) This Paris based Cameroonian has been the most in-demand drummer on the African and world circuit since the early 80's. In a remarkable career providing the drilling force for Salif Keita, Manu Dibango, Talking Heads, Don Cherry, Joe Zawinul and Sam Manwanga amongst others, he has promoted the drum kit to a front line instrument and is highly respected as a creative all round musician. Brice recently featured at Splashy Fen.

SERGIO DIAS (Brazil)

It is a privilege to feature one of Brazil's leaders in the "tropicalia" movement of the late sixties, who were instrumental in bringing down the then ruling military regime. A sublime guitarist/singer who once replaced John McLaughlin in the One Truth Band and has been voted Brazil's top guitarist five times, he has achieved world wide recognition through his work with the legendary "Os Mutantes". After acquiring a taste for South Africa with his well received "Song Of The Leopard" collaboration (partly with our Zulu songwriter Chris Faya) Sergio returns to work on his next project.

PEDRO ESPI-SANCHEZ (Spain)

TV's popular "music man" originally from Spain, fell in love with the music of Africa. He introduces his audiences to several traditional African instruments like the Zulu mtshingo flute, the Venda tshikona flute, the Zwingelengele bell and

gourd resonated bows, the incinge, mhube, xizambi and xitende. The unique & quite unbelievable sounds that he can get from a pumpkin stem (or a .5 inch PVC plumber's pipe) have had audiences around the world on their feet. Pedro works extensively with schools throughout South Africa & has appeard at many WOMAD festivals in Europe & the USA

LOBI TRAORE & OUSMANE DIARRA (Mali) with VINCENT BUCHE (France)

Bamako blues meets Chicago blues. The West African country of Mali has developed a reputation for producing a unique style of African blues (like Ali Farka Toure), so when Malian guitarman Lobi Traore met harmonica ace Vincent Buche a natural affinity resulted in an ongoing touring and recording partnership. Originally a busker in the Paris Metro, Vincent is now a much in demand session musician. Raised on the banks of the river Niger where he learnt his craft, Lobi is accompanied by Vincent and percussionist Ousmane Diarra.

RAY PHIRI & NICO CARSTENS (South Africa)

Two South African musical icons / legends, from two disparate African backgrounds - Ray from the street of Soweto with his 'Street Kids' Band - recording with Joan Baez or putting the Afro stamp on Paul Simon's legendary "Graceland" album to his own Stimela - playing concert halls of the world. Nico Carstens voted as the 2nd most popular Afrikaans musicians of the past 100 years was touring the USA before Ray was born and has become a legend in contemporary Africa. What a pleasure & honour it is to have these remarkable people play here in St. Lucia for the millennium & our heritage.

JEREMY TAYLOR (England)

A celebrated international folk singer & songwriter who spent most of his life teaching & singing in South Africa. He fell in love with the country in the 50's & stayed – for as long as he could - in between banning & deportation. His Huberta song has become an English classic. Best known for his satirical songs (Ag Pleez Deddy, Lift Girl's Lament, Transplant Calypso etc), Jeremy's more 'serious' compositions – reflecting nature, love & social injustice - have also become part of South African folklore history. From the thought provoking Piece of Ground recorded by Miriam Makeba in the USA, 1961 to one of his best-loved live performance music stories. HUBERTA THE HIPPOPOTAMUS.

SHIYANI NGCOBO (South Africa)

Shiyani is one of the finest solo maskanda exponents in KwaZulu Natal, home of this traditional Zulu music genre. Shiyani's crisp finger-picked melodies and lively rhythms have earned praise in international circles whilst at home he plays a humble trade as maskanda teacher at universities in the Durban district. He has been dubbed the 'Zulu Bluesman' by the media in France – he has played in Sweden, Reunion & Denmark & is feature in many of 3rd Ear Music's GUITARS FOR AFRICA projects. He's recorded a debut CD with MELT while appearing at the Nante Fin de Siecle Festival in France.

WENDY OLDFIELD (South Africa)

Described as a "...liberated, high profile singer/songwriter with great potential and originality ..." her move into the "world pop" direction has brought out elements in her style which highlight her emotional and creative depth. A riveting and exciting live performer, she has the opportunity at this Festival to be in touch with the things she loves – conservation, wildlife, a passionate for community and music with integrity.

CONCERTINA CLUB of kwaZuluNatal

Staying true to their roots and coming up with a real authentic sound, this dance happy crew brings the real Afrikaner spirit to of Boere Musiek to roost. Listen to it with an open mind – maybe one can call it modern trance music! The Band features Manie Ersamus – considered one of the world's great Concertina players & certainly one of the all time great exponents of 'real' Boeremusiek."

GRUPO DE TIMBILO ZAVALA (Mozambique)

A historic first ever visit to our shores for this exceptional timbila (marimba) orchestra, this group has been in existence for generations, and was originally led by the great composer and performer Katini Nyamombe Zavala. Going back to the days of the Portuguese explorers who discovered them, they have been part of an extensive ethnomusicological study who have published their history as "The Choppi musicians: their poetry and music"

YOUNG BA CUBA (Democratic Republic of Congo)

This 8-piece group are legal refugees from the trouble-torn Democratic Republic of Congo, who bring with them the delightful and delectable rhumba rhythms and soukous sounds so distinctive of Central Africa. With infectious guitar-driven riffs and hard-working dancers up-front the kwasa-kwasa style of Young Ba Cuba will provide a perfect way to end an evening. They were a hit at the 1999 Splashy Fen Festival & have just released a CD.

THE PACIFIC, ATLANTIC & INDIAN OCEAN PROJECT" featuring Djeli Moussa Diawari, Rene' Lacaille, Bob Brozman, Joel Gonthier & Bernard Marka

Certain to become a Festival highlight, this unique concept is based around the meetings of the oceans and the music of the slaves who used to express revolt and injustice in the Islands until the early seventies. This package incorporates all the inherent musical ingredients – the blues, the West African kora and the Islands sega, maloya and ternar rhythms.

BOB BROZMAN (USA) One of the world's most accomplished and diverse guitarists, Brozman is one of those rare artists of exceptional quality, whose wit, energy and depth of knowledge combine to create a powerful, unforgettable & truly live concert experience. A master of the blues, slide (bottleneck and lap) - hot jazz, National resonator, Hawaiian and Caribbean guitar styles.Bob's contribution to the Islands' project is sure to keep audiences on the edge of their seats

audiences on the edge of their seats. RENE LACAILLE (Reunion) His playing has been described as "intoxicating and rich, with textures so strong one can smell the sea and sand of his native island". An accordionist par excellence, and a singer who sings only in his native Creole, Rene' brings a sense of passion and purpose to any stage he graces. Having established a reputation as a sideman with Manu Dibango, Ray Lema and Cesaria Evora, he is deservedly now world - renowned in his own right, BERNARD MARKA (Comores) One of the island's best kept secrets, this sensitive and melodic percussionist is rapidly making a name for himself and was a major discovery at the recent Quebec Music Festival. He strengthens the rhythmic interplay in the complex musical arrangements and brings the rhythm of the Indian Ocean Islands to the Indian Ocean in St. Lucia's Wetland Estuary. JOEL GONTHIER (Seychelles) A larger than life character who is acknowledged as the world's leading exponent of Creole rhythms. Joel is now based in Bordeaux, France where he plies his trade with countless international stars. He brings his dexterity and humour to this collaboration and his knowledge of world rhythms adds a new dimension and provides the perfect foil to the exotic soloists

"A JOURNEY THRU' AFRICA" with SIMBA MORRI (Kenya), ADAMU' (Angola) & JOSEFF D (Swaziland)

The influences of Simba's music style derive from many parts of the continent. He calls it "Mashariki Muziki" and describes it as a blend of rhythms and styles that embrace the Swahili hi-life music of East Africa, socca from Central Africa, chimurenga from Zimbabwe with a touch of our own township Jazz. This special Festival collaboration features the lyrical vocals and guitar from Angolan Adamu' and the driving percussion of Joseff D from Swaziland in an experimental journey which demonstrates the rewards of musical exploration and adventure.

VUSI MAHLASELA (South Africa) & LOUIS MAHLANGA (Zimbabwe)

A real festival coup, this is a rare kwaZulu Natal live appearance for these two friends in a duo format! A real rags to riches story, Mahlasela from Mamelodi outside of Pretoria is being internationally acclaimed as "the new voice of the new South Africa". Zimbabwean Mahlanga is a highly respected solo artist and session musician in his own right and is considered the new wonder jazz guitarist with enormous talent and international potential.

DRUMS ACROSS (Denmark)

Uffe Olsen, Klaus Bo Larsen & Lars Stuck have been playing and travelling the world together for 20 years, and have developed their own unique sound and language. Although they are regarded as masters of African instruments, they have never lost their Viking roots, and it is this blend which gives them their identity. In another Festival exclusive, they are joined by local Zulu maskanda hero Madala Kunene on a collaboration which could well sow the seed for an album project.

MADALA KUNENE (South Africa)

While hipper Durban audiences are waking up to Madala's deep soul and his albums are selling well in Jo'burg, Paris, London and Oslo, his music is likely to be a valuable new experience at home for his friends and brethren in St. Lucia. The "King of Zulu Guitar" features his dynamic new band in the "Maskanda Magic" concert. Open yourself to this natural mystic and one of our real Living Treasures.

JOHANNES KERKORREL (South Africa)

Ex Journalist turned singer song writer from Cape Town, Kerkorrel set the 'conservative' world alight in the mid 80's with his GEREFORMEERDE BLUES BAND. It was the 'wagging finger' of PW Botha that got this living treasure fired from his job at Rapport – journalism's loss was the local music scene's gain. Johannes now performs his previously banned songs all over the world – in Afrikaans. He has recorded several CD's and it's a pleasure to have him sing for us on the beach in St. Lucia.

JENNIFER FERGUSON (South Africa)

This former UCT Drama graduate from Érmelo was a dedicated & committed activist / singer songwriters through the turbulent 80's. Jenny recorded several banned albums & produced some memorable live concerts. Known as the 'singing politician' – she served for 3 years as an ANC member of the National Parliament – she never let her work interfere with her performance – playing with some of South Africa's legendary musicians along the way. The re-issue of her UNTIMELY CD & her new revived concert career is a welcome return as one of this country's Living Treasurers.

PHUZEKHEMISI (South Africa)

From Umzinto on the South Coast, Phuzekhemisi received the "best maskanda album in South Africa" vote at the recent 1999 FNB Music Awards, an award he previously won in 1995. Often outspoken in his criticism of authority Phuzekhemisi has emerged from controversy and confrontation to be one of Kwa-Zulu Natal's favourite sons. He is a favoured artist for both king and president and is highly active in various peace and reconciliation programmes

14 SHABALALA (South Africa)

From Bergville in kwaZulu Natal, this rough diamond of a Living Treasure has a style and a sound like nobody on earth. 5 String self-tuned nylon guitar with a whistle & a voice that stuns & enthralls – no matter if you can understand Zulu or not. You will be entertained by 14. He recorded an album of songs for 3rd Ear Music in 1990 – and is still to see it escape & hear a moment's airtime. He is a popular maskandi (wandering minstrel / troubadour) in the Midlands of kwaZulu Natal – singing his stories of loves lost & hidden treasures.

T.H.C. (South Africa)

Durban's and now the country's most popular performance Drum-art group have struck a rich chord since releasing their well received debut album "Towards Higher Consciousness". Having wowed audiences at WOMAD and Oppikoppi, they are now ready to move to another level with the forthcoming release of their next album and a special collaboration with the **MSHENGU BROTHERS**.

JABU HLONGWANE -(South Africa)

Jabu has sung for Nelson Mandela & has worked with many international artists. His well known Gospel groups have sold gold & performed to thousands of people throughout the country. He is the co-founder of the community collaboration of artists: Joyous Celebration. His next CD is due for release early in 2000.

JACK IN THE GREEN (South Africa)

Another classic 'generation' stretch that's making South Africans of all ages sit up and take note -old

salt Dave Tarr - a Violin tugging Ocean Yacht Sea-Captain (that's his real profession) & a living local treasure from East London. Dave started his professional career as a violinist & mandolin player with the legendary SILVER CREEK MOUNTAIN BAND in the 60's and has been playing up a storm with young folk rock stylist & singer songwriter, PETE BRIERS for the past 2 years. From Irish jigs to hard Rock they can make a unique ageless combination.

ENDANGERED SPECIES (South Africa)As the name suggests these musicians have been around for many, many years. Ken E Henson has been enthralling audiences with his unique rock & folk style electric guitar since 1960 – Freedom's Children, Abstract Truth, Finch & Henson &

Harambee are but a few legendary bands that this 'living treasure' has fronted. With Durban percussion icon Richard Ellis & British Bassist Danny they present a set of 'sundowners' on the beach... they'll play the day out with their eclectic styles of music. Let's preserve our heritage...endangered species indeed!

SIBUSISO 'SBU' NTULI (SOUTH AFRICA)

A rare 'cultural phenomenon'. From the same (kwa Maphumulu) region (near Stanger) as John Gcaba, Sbu heard the Penny Whistle from his mother's old Johannesburg Township records - Lemmy Special, Spoke Mashiani, Albert Raululimi. However it was Mango Groove's version of Lemmy's 'Special Star' & 'Hell Fire' played by Mduduzi Magwaza that finally turned this reed-playing 'herd-boy' (cowboy) into the master Penny Whistler he has become. He is one of the best known Durban musicians - seen & heard regularly by thousands of people - outside of the Workshop Mall or the Stables Flea market - 'busking'.

JOHN GCABA (SOUTH AFRICA)

One of the finest Maskandi ("long distance" Zulu troubadours) in the country today & one of the last in a generation of musicians who excel in this style. There are not many of his type around anymore but the new generations of locals who hear him are on the new generations of locals who hear him are impressed & the European music lovers who get to hear this 'long distance / walking' music are labeling it the blues of the future. John – a gardener on the Berea - remains traditional in spirit. A master of the ndloku - a rare one stringed paraffin tin guitar played with a rudimentary bow and accompanied by charismatic singing – John keeps the mystique of maskandi & the Zulu traditional troubadour alive.

UMTSHEZI HEREOS (South Africa)

Formely known as Escourtezikhamashabala, this 10 man iSicathimeya outfit from Umlazi, has a penchant to perform for presidents & kings. Having recently featured at the International Commonwealth Conference at the ICC they have played for Mayor Mblaba & Ben Ngubane, for former State President Nelson Mandela & Chief Minister Buthelezi. They are

currently recording & are seriously planning an international tour. Listen to their story of Huberta the Myube.

ELLIS PEARSON & BHEKI MKHWANE (SOUTH

AFRICA) - Internationally renowned 'interactive theatre pair who have enthralled thousands of people all over the world with their antics - from environment to political & social issues, to just plain old fashioned comic relief & serious drama. Both are stars of many TV & theatre productions - Ellis having recently won acclaim for his role as the clown in the classic South African film, PALJAS.

SQUAWK ALTERNATIVE TITLE: AMAZWI OMOYA (THE WORDS OF THE WIND)



CHRISTOPHER FAYA (SOUTH AFRICA) - MC

He has been associated with 3rd Ear Music for almost 15 years. A serious Gospel singer-songwriter – (he composed the song 'A Thousand Hills' for Brazilian Sergio Dias ') - Chris has been active in the 'alternative' music scene in kZN for many years. He appears at St. Lucia as a presenter & has directed all the recent Satellite Festivals around Maputoland for the Lubombo SDI.
