

Marcalex, still riding on the success of their Quick, Quick and Heartbreakin' Love singles, and Bright Blue, who gave us Weeping, arrive for the Durban bash after appearing at the recent three-day Swaziland festival, which spotlighted Eric Clapton and Joan Armatrading.

Marcalex, to be backed in Durban by a group called Wired To The Floor, will also

be making its first apearance at a Natal pping centre tomorrow. It appears for an ır, from 1030 am, at the Hyperama in Prospecton.

The group, which plans to release a new single early next month, will appear from 630 pm. Admission is R8 a head, which includes a light snack.
