Concert buys a special car for crippled singer

Keith Blundell, the popular folk artist who was paralysed in a motorbike accident in February, received a specially adapted motor car at the weekend, thanks to friends and fans.

Des and Dawn Lindberg organised a giant folk festival in aid of Keith at the Wits Great Hall in Johannesburg on Saturday night — the first such folk music get-together in 15 years.

More than 1 000 people turned up including many members of the folk music fraternity who had travelled from far and wide to be there.

After the four-hour marathon concert an emotion-filled audience watched Dawn Lindberg present Keith with the car keys.

The money was raised by way of the benefit concert, which featured artists whose names are synonymous with the local folk movement in the '60s.

Keith performed at the end, seated in his wheelchair and surrounded by family. He later said the concert was a night he would always remember.
