ROGER LUCEY

Roger Lucey's music career began in the seventies where he developed his performance skills with musicians such as Steve Fatar of 'The Flames', Neil Solomon and David Marks. He moved to Johannesburg where he performed regularly at the legendary Mangles club in Braamfontein and in 1979, with the help of Johnny Clegg, John Oakley-Smith, Kendall Kay and George Wolfaardt amongst others he recorded his first album, 'The Road Is Much Longer'. It was soon banned for possession and distribution by the State. His next record, Half Alive which came out on the WEA label was restricted by the SABC.

Roger's most publicised band was the 'Zub Zub Marauders', with Ilna Hofmeyer, Johnny Blundel (Fat City), and Ian Herman ('Tananas'). He has written music for television documentaries, recorded with the 'Kalahari Surfers', contributed to the two End Conscription Campaign records, 'Forces Favourites' and 'A Naartjie in our Society' and created the very successful persona of 'Tighthead Fourie' who performed to enthusiastic audiences with his band 'The Loose Forwards' in Johannesburg.
