Clive's arrangement of Miriam Makeba's "Phata Phata" is another number on this L.P. to prove the versatility of our "Jill", the Nancy Sinatra dialogue "Jackson" is also a pleasing feature of this record, with drummer Tony Hughes effectively providing the "big talk" to Jill's cynical comments.

recently, "LIKE ME" (There's A River), one of the cuts on their last L.P.


Differs from the other members of the group in that he spends most of his leisure time composing new numbers, and playing his guitar.

<u>David Marks</u>, born Spiros David Markantonatos, son of a Greek father, Irish mother, and one of seven children, started composing whilst working underground on the gold mines at the age of 22. "Master Jack" was one of several numbers he composed initially, but despite having offered it to Des Lindberg and a number of other popular groups, nearly a year passed before it was popularised by 4 Jacks & a Jill on their 7 single which shot onto the Hit Parades in L.M., South Africa and eventually the U.S.A., Germany, Australia, etc.
