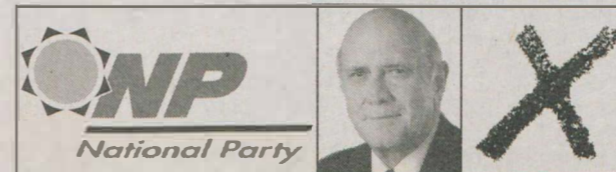
Zach de Beer has been a good leader but he doesn’t have enough support. I don’t think the DP will ever grow, in fact, I think they’ll disintegrate after the elections.
