REPORT of the Chairman and Directors of the Cape of Good Hope,
Bank, at the Half-yearly Meeting of Proprietors, held this 14th
Day of July, 1866.
1. In submitting to the Proprietors the Report and Statement of the Company's af-
fairs for the half-year ending the 30th June, 1866, the Directors beg to congratulate the
Shareholders on the satisfactory result of the transactions during that period.
2. From the Balance Sheet and Statement of Accounts made up to the 30th June, it
will be seen that the Next Profits for the half-year amount to £7,229 5s. 1d., and that in-
cluding the unappropriated balance brought forward from last account, the balance at the
credit of Profit and Loss is £13,598 10s. 11d.
3. The Directors, therefore, in discharge of the duty devolving on them under the
Trust Deed, hereby declare a Dividend of £3 per Share for the half-year, payable on and af-
ter the 16th instant.
4. After payment of the Dividend so declared, the balance remaining at the credit of
Profit and Loss, independent of Rebate of Interest on Bills Discounted not yet due, amount-
ing to £4,487 1s. 10d., will be £9080 14 11, to meet the anticipated loss on overdue Bills,
which, as stated at the last Meeting, may be estimated at £2,000, and otherwise serve as a
protecting fund for the payment of future dividends.
5. At a Special Meeting held on the 19th of last month, the Proprietors were called
upon to elect a Director in the room of the late Wm. HAWKINS Esq.; and the Directors take
opportunity of recording their appreciation of the services rendered to the Bank by their
late colleague during the many years he held a seat at the board.
6. In connection with the above, the Directors have to congratulate the Shareholders
on the election of a successor to Mr. HAWKINS, in the person of Wm. PORTER, Esq., late
Attorney-General of the Colony.

Loss for the next year. The Directors who retire by rotation are J. R. Zeeederberg, A.
Bosman de Villiers, and C. C. A. de Villiers, Esqs., one of whom is re-eligible pursuant to
Sec. 19, of the Trust Deed.
