### A CHARMING WEDDING.

### THE JUDEAN REGIMENT CONCERT.

My dear Cousin.

On Tuesday afternoon I went to one of the most charming weddings that has been solemnised for a long time, and one which attracted an unusual amount of interest. The contracting parties were Jennie, daughter of Mr. Councillor and Mrs. Harry Stodel, and Alfred, son of Mr. and Mrs. B. Wynick, of London. The ceremony was performed in the Great Synagogue by the Rev. A. P. Bender, assisted by the Rev. B. Strod; the service being fully choral, Mr. Isidor Fisher presiding at the organ. The interior of the Synagogue was tastefully decorated with lilies and other beautiful flowers. The bride made a dainty picture in a gown of ivory georgette over white satin, with a tunic of silver braid worked in silver beads, her head dress of orange blossoms was arranged over a white tulle veil. She was attended by three maids of honour, Miss Daisy Stodel, Miss Julia Stodel and Miss de Vries, who all wore gowns of primrose georgette and large black picture hats. The three bridesmaids Miss Rosie Stodel, Miss Jennie Espinosa and Miss Jennie Kruyer looked charming; the first two in white net frocks with hats to match, and Miss Kruyer in a frock of blue georgette and shadow lace. There were also two little flowers girls, Miss Marie Kruyer, who carried a basket of rose petals, and Miss Dolly Kruyer—and these little damsels strewed the path of the bride with flowers. The *unterfuhrers* were Mr. and Mrs. Stodel and Mr. and Mrs. Kruyer. Mrs. Stodel wore a handsome dress of navy blue georgette over gold lace, hand embroidered in silk velour, with a hat draped with lime coloured silk. Mrs. Kruyer was in pale grey taffetas and georgette, her black hat adorned with an osprey.

During the afternoon a reception was held in the Banqueting and Minor Halls of the City Hall where over 200 guests assembled. Among those present were the Mayor, Mr. Harry Hands; the Deputy Mayor Mr. J. R. Verster, Mr. J. W. Musket, Mr. Eames Perkins, Adv. and Mrs. Alexander and many other distinguished citizens. The Rev. A. P. Bender in felicitous terms proposed the health of the happy pair, and after the bridegroom had responded, the Mayor proposed the health of the parents of the bride and groom. In doing so the Mayor paid a high tribute to Mr. and Mrs. Stodel for the keen interest displayed by them in every form of patriotic and charitable work. No one, he said, had been more liberal when called upon, than Mr. Stodel in assisting in war work matters and municipal affairs, while Mrs. Stodel had shown herself to be no less ready to render help in a good cause. The toast was drunk with musical honours. Mr. Stodel briefly responded. There was a large number of gifts including much beautiful silverware and many cheques. Among these latter was one from the Theatres Trusts, another from the African Films Trust and one from Mr. Schlesinger. Fishers orchestra played selections throughout the afternoon and the catering arrangements were excellent.

A great success attended the Concert given Tuesday evening in aid of the Care and Comfort Fund of the Judean Regiment. It was held in the City Hall under the auspices of the combined Committees of the Dorshei Zion Association, the Ladies' Zionist Society and the Junior Zionist Society, the arrangements, excellently carried out, being under the direction of the Rev. B. Strod and Messrs. I Schwartz and I.M. Goodman. There was a very large attendance of the

Jewish Community and the programme was of the very highest standard. The artists included Mr. Adolph Hallis, Mr. Wolf Wolfensohn and Miss Olga Katzin.

Little Master Goodman of whom I have so often written you and who is really an infant prodigy, played a piano concerto by Mozart with Adolph Hallis at the College of Music Concert the other evening.

At an examination in First Aid, held at the offices of the St. John Ambulance Association, the Misses Jessie Asher, Dina Clain, Ray Hermann, Pearl Jacobs, Louise Kuttel and Florrie Rosenthal satisfied the examiner.
