My dear Cousin,

This has been Rosebank show week and town is full of up-country visitors. I did not go to the show this year. Really I could not summon up the energy, and after all unless one is a farmer there is little new to interest one. It is the same old story year by year and only the connoisseur can conjure up enthusiasm over the head of a bull or the tail of a sheep! The farmers on the other hand can gaze in rhapsody at even a pig and have flocked to Rosebank in great numbers. There was the usual list of exhibits—jumping competitions, etc

It has been very hot this week, and the heat has been accentuated by a succession of mountain fires. This wanton destruction of old beautiful trees is just heartbreaking. At Tokai the whole plantation was ablaze, probably on account of the careless discard of a lighted cigarette, Devils Peak was a giant furnace and Signal Hill likewise—wonderful sights at night time, but oh! such sad ones. To see charred shrubs and black patches of veldt instead of the glorious forests and green mountain sides makes even the materialist weep. There was a big fire at Muizenberg too—a whole block of buildings burnt down, including the Victoria Hotel.
