#### GENERAL NEWS

My dear Cousin,

This week has been crowded with affairs of Jewish interest.

On Wednesday evening the Bnoth Zion Association arranged a Grand Concert in aid of the Jewish National Fund. The concert was held in the Railway Institute, where a good audience gathered to enjoy the excellent programme. The various artists acquitted themselves creditably and thanks are due to them for their respective items.

Miss Ethel Zin gave as her first item a piano solo, Barcarolle (Moskowsky). Later in the evening she rendered another piano solo in a brilliant manner. Mr. Osprovat played in a pleasing style. His first violin solo was by Drala and one other by D'Ambrosio.

Miss Flosie Somnitz's 'cello solo earned for her an encore.

The vocalists, Miss M. van der Westhuizen and Mr. Tre deserve the thanks of the committee for their services and the acceptable renderings of their songs.

Miss Cecile de Banke recited in a manner which drew applause from the audience. Mr. I. Choscak accompanied by Miss I. Massiah was applauded for several items on the xylophone. Miss Raie da Costa danced in a manner which showed that she interpreted the spirit of the Russian Dance.

The concert was one of the most enjoyable I have attended and should prove a success.

The Reception Committee for the Dr. Hertz Welcome are very active. A public meeting is to be held in the City Hall on the 1st Nov. to welcome Dr. Hertz. On 2nd Nov. a public dinner is to be given also in the City Hall. It is expected that a large number of guests will be present.

The Jewish Amateur Dramatic and Literary Society are having a social at the Railway Institute tonight. The chief feature of the evening is a talk on "Folk-Lore" by Dr. Olsvanger. The evening is sure to prove a success as this society has among the members very many talented artists.

The marriage is announced to take place to day at the Gardens Synagogue of Mr. Louis E. Berman (the clever half back, who played for the Transvaal team in 1914 Currie Cup tournament and captained the combined Pretoria team against the Witwatersrand for that year and on several other occasions) and Miss E. Robinson, daughter of the Rev. and Mrs. A. Robinson.

The Frank and Warshaw case about which I wrote to you some time ago has no been concluded. You will remember that the Law Society were bringing an action against Frank and Warshaw because of certain unprofessional conduct, which it is alleged the defendants were guilty of. The chief witness for the law Society was Litton on whose evidence practically the whole case depended.

In the course of his judgment, Sir John Kotze remarked that in regard to the evidence, which depended entirely on the credibility of Litton he was not prepared to act on it in the absence of substantial corroboration.

Litton was convicted of shop breaking and was undergoing sentence. Litton it appeared was annoyed because Frank and Warshaw had refused to bail him out, when he was arrested sometime back.

In summing up Sir John Kotze stated that the Law Society should have carefully investigated the complaint brought against Frank & Warshaw. In the present instance it seemed,

that the Law Society had not kept this in mind. The books of Frank and Warshaw had not been inspected by the Society until July of the present year, a few weeks before the case.

The judgment was therefore returned for defendants with costs.

The Jewish Orphanage committee have now begun work seriously. A strong and energetic body of workers are engaged in devising means of how to get in the requisite amount of money.

It has been estimated that £500 capitalised will provide for the support of one of these orphans till 16 years of age.

The committee are taking steps to advertise their scheme. The Jewish Orphanage intend to bring out 100 orphans and to accommodate them at the local institute. I am sure the committee have the whole hearted support of the community.

The Young Israel Society are having a dance on 3 Nov. in the Railway Institute in aid of the Palestine Restoration Fund. The dance is under distinguished patronage and there is every reason to expect an enjoyable and successful event.

I regret to report the death of Mr. Bairski of Liberman and Bairski. Mr. Bairski was one of the oldest and best known men in Capetown.

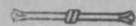
