Mayszka Feinberg Pokraka-Lobbas continued with his antics until he came in collision with the criminal authorities.

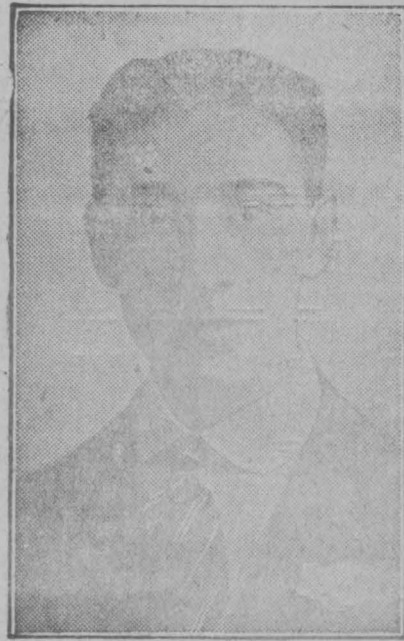
A charge of immoral conduct was hanging over him.
