May we, therefore, venture to hope that you will be good enough to send the Committee a liberal contribution to the Special Passover Fund, as we fear that unless we receive a widespread and generous response to this appeal, we shall not be able to provide our poor and needy co-religionists with the necessary articles of Passover fare. This obligation has always been borne hitherto by the Capetown Community, but the present abnormal conditions and the increase of poverty compel us to appeal to others beyond our borders for assistance in carrying out this essential work.
