

Latest Music.

Many vocalists find great difficulty in obtaining suitable short songs as encores but they could not do better than make their choice from the latest list of selections of this kind issued by Messrs. Augener and Co., Ltd., of Great Marlborough Street, London. Eight, which I certainly can cordially recommend are, "Hey Nonny No" and "Night" by D. M. Stewart, "The Milkmaid's Song" by Charles V. Stanford, "To The Memory Of A Great Singer" by Peter Warlock, "May" by E. A. Forbes MacLennan, "The Reason" by Vivian Hickey and "When Death To Either Shall Come", and "Cradle Song" by Muriel Herbert. Ethel Boyce is responsible for three, three part songs which are as follows: "Coronach", "How Many Times" and "Magic Lutes". Coming to instrumental music we have an interesting as well as a varied selection of the highest order. Taking that for the pianoforte first, we have no fewer than eleven compositions by no fewer than seven composers. Adam Carse is responsible for no less than four,—"Impromptu", "Fairy Glow", "Prelude", and "Nocturne". George Aitken for two,—"Exile" and "Butterfly", Peter Warlock for a suite entitled "Folk-Song Preludes", Gustav Lind has composed a suite aptly named "The Silent Mere", Hubert Bath; one of the leading lights of modern composers has a suite entitled "My Lady" included, whilst John Ireland's contribution to the latest list is called "Equinox." For violin and pianoforte there is B. J. Dale's "Prunella" and Gerald Walenin's "Episode Romantique." Last but not least there are selections for trios including Schubert's Trio No. 1 in B Flat.
