Tickets were sold to residents and other friends from outside. As a result, the large dining room was packed to the doors, and the small charge that was made for admittance resulted in the sum of over £7. 0. 0. being handed to the Orphanage.

A Conference of great importance to the local Jewish community was held last Sunday morning at the Old Synagogue, Rabbi M. Ch. Mirvish presiding.

There were delegates present representing the majority of Jewish Congregations and other Institutions in and around the Cape.

The Conference was called by the Cape Province Branch of the United South African Relief, Reconstruction and Orphans Fund, in order to consider the future of the Fund, and the attitude of the Cape towards the decision of the all South African Relief Conference recently held in Johannesburg.

After considerable discussion, it was decided that the Cape should fall into line with the Johannesburg decision, that is, to carry on the work of the Fund for another year with as much vigour as possible, in order to raise sufficient funds to meet the liabilities in connection with the maintenance of the 130 war orphans, who have been settled in Palestine on the express

undertaking that they will be maintained by the Jews of South Africa. It is estimated that in addition to the £7,000 on hand, another £12,500 will be required to fund this scheme.

Besides the raising of this money, in view of the very sad reports which have recently arrived here from the Ukraine, to the effect that the economic position of the vast majority of the Jews is worse than it has been during and immediately after the War, it has been decided to allot 25% of all funds collected for the relief of the distress of the widows and orphans in the Ukraine.

The Committee of the Relief Fund has been augmented and an appeal will shortly be issued for an extensive campaign throughout the Jewish Community in South Africa, for the revival of the activities of the various branches of the Relief Fund, in order to raise the necessary funds to meet the above obligations.
