The Leibnitz Gold Medal for the year 1925 was awarded by the French Academy of Science to Dr. Arthur Salomonsohn, director of the Disconto Gessellschaft for his services rendered to scientific work in Germany.

Still Saving the Revolution.

According to a Berlin report, fully 3,617 persons, accused of membership in the Zionist Organisation, were arrested by the Cheka from March, 1924, till May, 1925.
