Petersburgh, and that he should practice in the Russian courts, and his speciality should be making violent attacks upon the Jews.'

"Marshall Hall said he had not attacked the Jews, but the Judge roundly contradicted him, and I got a verdict. In the robing room Marshall Hall came up to me and said in a delightfully kind manner: 'My dear Abinger, I had quite forgotten that you yourself were a member of that very ancient faith.'

"I accept what you say,' I replied, smiling, and quite mollified, but I bear upon my countenance (pointing to my nose) the signs of a race nearly six thousand years old, and it is really difficult to imagine you should have missed so conspicuous a feature!'

"We remained the best of friends until his recent death, which I, along with many thousands of others, deeply deplore."

LEGAL POSITION OF THE JEWESS.

The annual report of the Council for the Amelioration of the Legal Position of the Jewess has just been issued. The objects of the Council

To press only for such measures of relief as would bring practical help to women who, under existing laws, would be liable to suffer serious hardship, leaving aside all such smaller grievances as might prejudice the main issue; to consult with Jewish communal workers in all lands respecting the legal difficulties of Jewesses; to consult with Jewish scholars as to the best methods and arguments to employ in order to obtain the desired results; and to lay women's considered demands ultimately before a Conference of Orthodox Rabbis. After surveying the various activities of the Council during the year, the report concludes:

The Council wishes to lay stress upon the fact that it is composed entirely of Orthodox communal workers, some Zionist, some non-Zionist, striving in unison for the improvement of conditions both in Palestine and other lands. The Council feels that all well-wishers should be greatly encouraged by the course which has been adopted by the Conference of Anglo-Jewish preachers and by the Board of Deputies of British Jews, in urging that the initial steps may be taken for convening a Universal Rabbinical Assembly. Such an Assembly would have power to deal with the legal disabilities of Jewesses all over the world; and it is hoped that this project will receive the moral and financial support of all who can help even in the smallest degree to bring it to fruition.

Prominent representatives of the Protestant, Catholic and Jewish faiths in Germany have formed a joint council of religious communities to constitute the German Branch of the Universal Religious Peace Conference.

Professor Albert Einstein, Rabbi Dr. Leo Baeck, and Herr Oscar Wasserman are among the Jewish signatories to the appeal which has been issued asking for support of the work of the new Council, and the Catholic signatories include Prince Max of Saxony.
