## East Rand Jewry.

### COMMUNAL NOTES

#### Benoni.

East Rand Jewry, and Benoni particularly, has responded magnificently to the Palestine Emergency Fund. We doubt whether any other town in the Union can boast of such a proud record. Small as the Jewish population of the town is, nevertheless a sum of £1,000 was quickly collected within a week, this including £503 which had been collected in the short space of ten minutes. And the other East Rand towns—Boksburg, Springs, Germiston and Brakpan—were not slow in following Benoni's excellent example.

The Charity Ball of the Benoni United Hebrew Institutions, which was to have been held on the 4th and which was postponed as a result of the recent outrages, has been fixed for Wednesday, September 25th. The funds from this function are to go to local charities. This ball is undoubtedly the outstanding Jewish social event of the year on the East Rand.

#### Yiddish Plays.

During the last week East Rand Jewry has been fortunate in that a number of Yiddish plays have been staged at the various centres. In Benoni at the Savoy Theatre, Mr. H. Berman's New Yiddische Company staged "When a Man Loves" last week, while the two famous Jewish vaudeville artistes, Miss Mary Aingorm and Mr. B. Abrahamoff, appeared at the Masonic Hall, Boksburg, in a Yiddish concert. The funds from this concert, and from a similar one held at Brakpan, are to go to the Palestine Emergency Fund.

Meanwhile a band of Benoni Jewish amateurs are discussing the possibility of staging a Yiddish play in Benoni.

While the patronage and support accorded to the Cultural Society's Library, which has an excellent selection of books, is indeed deplorable, it is to be noted that quite a number of Jewish citizens are borrowers from the Public Library. From figures supplied by the Librarian, it appears that fiction is preferred over other subjects by Jewish readers. Next comes Poetry, then literature and history. Very few books on science and arts, and none at all on religion.
