It is hardly necessary to emphasise that the hall will be an invaluable asset to the Pretoria community and will supply a want that has been felt with increasing acuteness every year that

has passed.

The opening of the hall will be marked by a grand fête, which will be held in the building, not only to celebrate its completion, but also to enable it to come into the hands of the community with the minimum burden of debt.
