## A Great Jewish Pianist.

MOISEIWITSCH FOR SOUTH AFRICA.

The interesting announcement is made by Mr. L. Cherniavsky that he has prevailed upon Mr. Benno Moiseiwitsch, the celebrated Jewish pianist, to come to South Africa for a series of concerts. Moiseiwitsch commenced his artistic career at the Imperial Music Academy, where he won the Rubenstein Prize at the age of nine years, later going to Vienna to study under Leschetitzky. His debut was made in England on the 1st October, 1908, when he created a sensation. His appearance with the Queen's Hall Orchestra under foremost conductors of the day, and his own recitals were scenes of tremendous enthusiasm. In America his success was instantaneous.



The New York critics painted wonderful word pictures of the young artist's playing, and the enthusiasm eclipsed all previous memories.

During the last three seasons Benno Moiseiwitsch has become the favourite pianist of the day, the idol of England, America and France. He has the technique and the touch with which huge audiences can be thrilled and charmed.
