Grand Purim Carnival

All arrangements for the Purim Carnival which is to take place at the Langham Hotel on Sunday evening the 12th March, are now complete. Rehearsals of the tableaux have already taken place and if one is to judge by the enthusiasm which prevails at these rehearsals which are participated in by no less than 60 persons, the carnival will be an outstanding success.

The whole carnival will take the form of a feast arranged by King Xerxes of Persia. Special songs have been composed for the occasion. In order to choose a Queen for King Xerxes, who divorces Queen Vashti because she refuses to appear before the assembled guests unveiled a "Queen Esther Beauty Contest" will take place. As Queen Esther is being crowned Jewish national songs will be sung by a specially selected choir of male and female voices, the band will play national tunes and the spirit of the carnival—that of Tel Aviv—will have captured all present.

The next tableaux will depict the King's denunciation of Haman and then Haman will lead a procession through the hall carrying Mordecai aloft shouting "Thus is to be done to the man whom the King wishes to honour"; the fancy dress competition will then be judged. Refreshments will be served and dancing continued till a late hour.

Tickets are obtainable at Polliacks, or from members of the Hatechiya Organisation or the Bertrams Judean Society, who are arranging this Carnival.

It is hoped that the Jewish public will not miss this function.
