Jewish Community Paper Closed Down

Berlin, August 1st.

THE official organ of the Breslau Jewish Community was closed down to-day by the authorities, following the arrest last week of the head of the Community, Dr. Ernst Rechnittz, and of Herr Albert Rosenthal, the editor of the paper, because of an article by Herr Rosenthal headed, "I Seek My Brothers."

When the arrests were made (Dr. Rechnittz and Herr Rosenthal have been sent to a concentration camp), the authorities alleged that the article contained untrue statements with regard to the present treatment of the Jews in Germany, tending to give new ground for atrocity propaganda abroad.

Dr. Rechnittz was arrested in his capacity as head of the Community, on the ground that as such he is responsible for all that appears in the Community's official organ. The order for closing down the paper has been issued by the State President, "in the interest of public security."

Death Sentence Demanded for Jews "Misleading" German Girls

Berlin, August 7th.

"JEWS who mislead German girls should be sentenced to death," Deputy Muenchmeyer, the notorious anti-Jewish agitator, demanded in addressing a National Socialist meeting at Nuremberg to-day.

The speech, coming on top of the already dangerous anti-Jewish feeling in Nuremberg, is making the position of the Jewish population extremely difficult, and adding to the numbers of Jews who are leaving the city.

No Jews in Wagner Association

Berlin, August 7th.

THE All-German Wagner Association has adopted a resolution at its Annual Conference held at Beyruth that only Aryans may be members. All branches throughout the country have been instructed to expel their Jewish members.

Jewish Shopkeepers Taken Into "Protective Custody"

Berlin, August 3rd.

A JEW named Oko who had a shoeshop at Rottweill on the Neckar, has been taken into protective custody by the police, and his shop closed down, on the ground that a menacing crowd had collected outside his shop to protest against the low prices he had fixed for his goods in announcing a clearance sale.

Raceology as Compulsory Subject for German Doctors

Berlin, August 2nd.

THE first course in racial problems was opened to-day at Halle University, with about 500 doctors present, a third of the total number of medical men in Saxony.

State Commissar Haman, in his opening speech, said that laws would be issued applying to the whole of Germany, requiring all doctors to provide proof within a year or two that they have been passed through a special raceology course, without which they will not be permitted to practise.

Renegade Jews Not Wanted by Nazis

Berlin, August 5th.

A JEWISH journalist was sentenced in Frankfort to-day to two months' imprisonment for wearing a Swastika.

It was true he was a Jew by birth, the accused pleaded in court, but he considered himself a fighter in the ranks of the National Socialist movement. He had renounced Judaism as far back as 1922, and he had helped the present authorities to discover a Communist organisation. He had even applied for membership in the National Socialist Party.

The court rejected his plea, declaring that his renunciation of Judaism does not alter the fact that he is a Jew, and since no Jew may be a member of the National Socialist Party, he had no right to wear the Swastika.
