### Fine Singing by Madame Belmas

A GOOD METRO CONCERT.

The second concert of Madame Xenia Belmas attracted a good audience at the Metro Theatre on Sunday evening last. Unfortunately this fine dramatic singer was suffering from a cold and was therefore unable to reach the high level of singing to which she accustomed us at her first recital.

Madame Belmas nevertheless rendered a number of items in beautiful tone and was applauded throughout the evening. Her singing is specially notable and enjoyable in the Russian compositions; some of her Tchaikowsky items being really beautiful. Madame Belmas is a good delineator of Jewish folk songs, her lullaby being rendered with great charm and poignancy.

The artist was accompanied by Dr. Alexander Kitchine, a noted Russian conductor. During the evening, Mr. Herman Becker, the well-known local musician, rendered a number of 'cello items.
