HADASSAH PLANTING THREE FORESTS IN PALESTINE

Jerusalem, March 19th.

A SUM of £2,000,000 has been handed over to the Jewish National Fund by Hadassah, the American Women's Zionist Organisation, for the purpose of planting a forest in the name of Justice Louis Brandeis. In addition a special Hadassah forest of 20,000 trees is to be planted near Kiriath Anavim; and a third forest in honour of Miss Henrietta Szold will be planted near the site of the new Medical Centre on Mount Scopus.

A special fund of £65,000 has been collected by the Hadassah for their recent undertaking to retrieve 32,000 dunams of land near the Haifa Bay.

AMERICAN FRIENDS OF HEBREW UNIVERSITY MEET RECTOR

New York, March 24th.

THE American "Friends of the Hebrew University" gave a dinner in honour of Professor Hugo Bergmann, the Rector of the Hebrew University, at the Waldorf Astoria Hotel last night.

The speakers included Professor Albert Einstein, Chancellor Chase, of the New York University, Mr. Roger Straus and Mr. Edward Warburg.

THE PALESTINE ORCHESTRA AT NATHANIA

THE go-ahead Jewish settlement of Nathania (situated on the coastal belt of the Sharon) was the scene of great enthusiasm when the Palestine Orchestra recently visited the settlement. The hall was filled to capacity with the settlers of Nathania and the neighbouring villages of the Sharon.

Among those present were Assistant District Commissioner for the North, Mr. H. M. Foot, officers of the Nathania garrison, Mr. Ben Ami, chairman of the local Council, and several Arab Sheikhs from the neighbourhood. After the concert a gathering was held at which Mr. Foot and Mr. Ben Ami spoke, congratulating the orchestra on its achievements.

JEWISH GHAFIRS ENTER POLICE FORCE

Jerusalem, March 22nd.

A HUNDRED Jewish supernumerary police who had been enrolled during the recent disturbances in Tel-Aviv have now entered the regular police force.

IMPORTANT ACCESSION BY ZIONIST ARCHIVES

THE Zionist Archives in Jerusalem have this month received an important accession — the archives of Dr. Theodor Herzl, hitherto in the possession of the trustees of his estate. The documents contain valuable information about the early period of Zionism, dating back to the establishment of the World Zionist Organisation. A detailed survey of the nature of these documents (which will serve as a valuable source of information for students of Zionist history), will shortly be published by the Zionist Archives.

PASSOVER RELIEF IN POLAND

Warsaw, March 23rd.

ONE thousand six hundred Jewish families have applied for Passover relief to the Radom Jewish Community and over 1,000 Jewish families have applied for Passover relief to the Sosnowiec Jewish Community.

The Lemberg Municipal Council has cancelled all the subsidies for Jewish institutions.

"ORT" PAVILION AT PALESTINE EXHIBITION

THE "ORT" Union will have a pavilion of its own at the Palestine World Exhibition. The "ORT" pavilion is already completed.

In this Pavilion there will be exhibited works of the Technical Schools and workshops of the "ORT" in the various countries, and products of the "ORT" factories and Jewish Agricultural Co-operatives which "ORT" has established in Poland, Roumania and other European countries.

RESEARCH WORK ON GERMAN JEWS

Berlin, February 26th.

A PAMPHLET written by two Jewish research workers on the subject of death among the Berlin Jews has just been issued here. The pamphlet proves that cases of suicide among Jews in Germany are more frequent than among non-Jews. The two research workers examined the records of over 14,000 deaths among Jews and their investigations show that for the period 1924 to 1926 the percentage of suicide among Jewish males was 1.5 per cent, more frequent than among non-Jews, and in the case of females was 1.5 per cent, more than among non-Jews. For the period 1927 to 1934 the cases of suicide among Jewish females have considerably increased with the corresponding increase in the percentage of Jewish suicides as compared with non-Jewish
