NEWS OF JEWISH ACTIVITIES THROUGHOUT SOUTH AFRICA

**Bethal**

The Zionist association is as active as ever. The February and March card evenings yielded £9 9s. 2d. for the National Fund. The Fund also benefited to the amount of £16 2s. 4d., from the nett proceeds of the annual picnic, held by the association on April 11. This function, which took place at the farm of Messrs. Slifken and Smith, at Kalabasfontein, proved as great a success as ever, some two hundred people being present.

**Bellville, Parow and Durbanville**

The annual meeting of the Bellville, Parow and Durbanville Ladies' Zionist Society took place at the Communal Hall on Sunday, the 2nd inst., and the following were elected: Mrs. M. **Malmesbury**

Rabbi Schwartz addressed a meeting of the local Hebrew Congregation on the 4th inst. at the Malmesbury Talmud Torah Hall. Mr. W. Beinart was in the chair.

The first part of his lecture Rabbi Schwartz devoted to the question of whether Zionism had been created by the inherent love of the Jewish people for Zion, or whether it had been stimulated by Hitlerism and Fascism. He then touched upon the position of world Jewry in the Galuth. It had been proved, throughout the ages that no land other than Eretz Israel could possibly become the permanent homeland of the Jewish people.

Rabbi Schwartz compared the bright hopes that Eretz Israel held out to the Jewish people with the pessimistic outlook of the other countries of the world, and before concluding, dealt with the destructive policy of the Revisionists.

Rev. Effron thanked Rabbi Schwartz for his interesting lecture, and the meeting concluded with the chairman thanking those present for their attendance.
