The Johannesburg Symphor Society held its 24th concert at 13 Wanderers Hall on Thursday las Miss Elsie Hall gave a magnifice performance of the Schumann Certo in A Minor, opus 54, followed by Anton Bruckner's Symphony N 7 in E Major, with Mr. Joseph Tranneck as conductor. neck as conductor.

This piano concerto, typical of Schumann in his best moods, was handled with skill to the point of perfection. Miss Hall displayed a master ful technique and a perfectly balance emotional sense. Her tone graditions and smooth legato playing dilighted the audience. The man changes of tempo and style were played with complete control. The brilliant work has a colourful bacter ground in the orchestral accompanment. After such an inspiring performance the wholehearted ovation she received compelled Miss Hall treturn for two encores.

The other item on the programma Bruckner's Symphony, performed for the first time in Johannesburg, is in teresting due to its unusual treatment. Each section of the orchestrates was given an apportunity to displaitiself to advantage in the tremendout technical difficulties presented. The emotional conception reached a vern high level, the repeated rumbling of the drums bringing each movement to a terrific climax. Mr. Traunect who has widened the musical reputoire of Johannesburg concert-goen chose this difficult symphony to provide capabilities of his orchestra and the result was very much worth whill H.F.
