A NEW WEEKLY NEWSPAPER

"Die Yiddische Post" (The
Jewish Mail)

A NEW journal has appeared on
the local Jewish horizon in "Die
Yiddische Post" (Jewish Mail). It
is published weekly in Johannesburg
and is a well-printed and well-edited
production.

In its opening editorial, the paper
points out that the purpose is to pre-
sent progressive communal matters
before the Jewish public in this coun-
try. It also states that Jewish mass-
es cannot remain indifferent to the
present struggle between Facism and
Democracy, and that the peace of the
world and of the Jewish people is de-
pendent upon a victory for democ-
racy.

"Die Yiddische Post" will stand for
the workers in Palestine as the van-
guard of the national movement. The
aims and ideals and accomplishments
of the Jewish workers will be out-
lined in the columns of the journal.
The paper calls upon all forces of
democracy to lend support to the new
project so that a responsible demo-
cratic organ will become firmly estab-
lished as part and parcel of South
African Jewish activity.

The editor of the new journal is the
well known journalist, Mr. J. Batnit-
sky, and the editorial offices are 17-
21 Warwick House, Joubert Street,
Johannesburg.

Jewish Productive Help Organisation

A group of young Jewish men in
Johannesburg have recently organised
themselves into a society, the aim of
which is to assist their members who
find themselves unemployed. They
have devised a scheme whereby Pal-
estinian goods are imported and dis-
tributed to the members of the society
who will in turn sell them to the
members of the community.

The work of this organisation has
thus a two-fold object, firstly it
greatly assists those directly con-
cerned and secondly is a commendable
manner in bringing to the notice of
the local Jewish community the ex-
cellence of the Palestinian products
available and thus finding a market
for these in this country. Represent-
atives of this organisation recently in-
terviewed Rabbi Meir Berlin and
Chief Rabbi Dr. J. L. Landau who
heartily endorsed the two-fold aim
and work of this newly-founded

Three very successful meetings
were held at Pretoria, Benoni and
Krugersdorp, on Monday evening,
3rd July.

Miss Ruth Hayman and Mr. Aaron
Abrahamson addressed a crowded
meeting at the Memorial Hall in Pre-
toria. Mr. A. Wyschek presided and
musical items were rendered by Mr.
Marcelle Ginsberg and the Habonim
choir under Mr. J. Greenstein.

Miss Hayman outlined the J.N.F.
Youth Week and called for contin-
uous work on the part of the Youth
throughout the year, while Mr. Ab-
rahamson gave a talk on his experi-
ences in Eretz Israel. Mr. N. Horwitz
thanked the speakers and others par-
ticipating in the meeting.

Dr. H. Bloomberg and Mr. D.
Dunsky addressed a successful meet-
ing at Krugersdorp under the chair-
manship of Mr. B. Furman. Dr.
Bloomberg dealt with Zionist Youth
problems and Mr. Dunsky gave a
comprehensive address on his impres-
sions of Eretz Israel.

Miss L. Rosenstein of the Transvaal
Zionist Youth Executive presided over
a fairly large gathering at the He-
brew Hall, Benoni, consisting of
representatives of the East Rand Zi-
onist Youth Societies. Mr. E. Kluk,
Assistant Secretary of the S.A. Zion-
ist Federation, delivered an inspiring
address on the recent events in Pal-
estine, stressing the heroic stand
adopted by the Yishuv throughout,
which could serve as an example to
the Youth of South Africa.

He was followed by Mr. M.
Schneider of Springs who outlined
the circumstances which had brought
the J.N.F. into being. Continuing he
dealt with its great achievements in
the settlement of Jews on the land,
and the vital part which it played in
National Colonization. He appealed
to all those present to do their share
in assisting the progress of this great
task.

A number of other functions, in-
cluding a theatre evening and an
"Oneg Shabat," also took place.

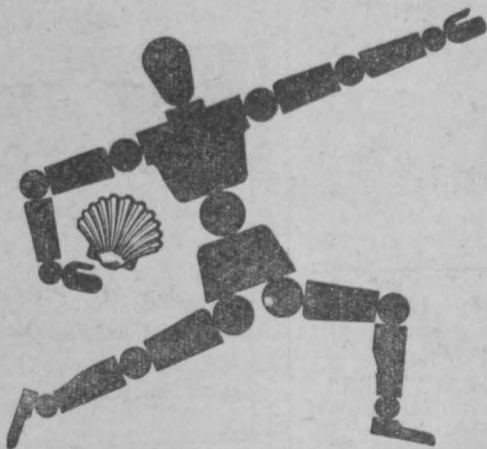
CANTOR B. CHAGY
