Brith Trumpeldor Celebration.

The celebration of the tenth anniversary of the Brith Trumpeldor Movement and of the *Chanukath Habaith* of the local branch's new hall was held on Sunday night last.

Mr. M. Ben Arie, in opening the function, expressed his pleasure in seeing so many visitors present. He then proceeded to trace the evolution of the Betar movement from the first meeting of a dozen men in far away Riga to the present world-wide movement which, he said, consisted of over 65,000 young Jews.
