THE OPERA HOUSE.

The Russian Ballet.

Next week at the Opera House will be the farewell week of the Russian Ballet and there will be a complete change of programme. Among the featured items first comes Chopin's "Les Sylphides." The late Pavlova regarded Chopin as her favourite composer, saying that the great Polish composer, better than anyone else perhaps, has given to his music that quality which enables it to be interpreted so well by movements. Another featured item will be Drigo's "Magic Flute." Here is one of the most popular ballets with London and Continental audiences—being light and humorous. An interesting announcement is that Mle. Nemchinova and Mle. Bousovitch, the two leading dancers, are appearing together for the first time. It will probably be years before Russian Ballet again visits Cape Town, and to miss them is to miss something distinctly unique.

'Hips, Hips, Hooray.'

Smartly and enthusiastically insane, abounding in laughs of the side-splitting variety, "Hips, Hips, Hooray" presents the star comedians, Bert Wheeler and Robert Woolsey in a musical extravaganza surpassing all their previous efforts. This RKO-Radio picture starts on Monday next at the Plaza.

"Hips, Hips, Hooray" offers besides Wheeler and Woolsey, scores of eye-filling beauties in spectacular dances brilliantly conceived. "The Washington Masquerade."

"I secured every newspaper item I could find about the Senate and all speeches and details of the tax legislation," explained Barrymore in a recent interview. "By studying them I found out what sort of a character a Senator in action would be.

"I don't know any Senators and never was in politics, but the newspaper and wire service items gave me a better idea than I could have obtained by actually being on the floor of the Senate."

Karen Morley has the chief feminine role in "The Washington Masquerade," and the cast also includes Diane Sinclair and Nils Asther.

Capetown Orchestra Activities.

On Sunday evening next in the City Hall the Orchestra will render a popular programme of music. The soloist will be Vera Pentelow, who is the possessor of a beautiful voice. Next Thursday's programme in place of the usual symphony concert will be devoted to a violin recital by that excellent violinist Mr. Ellie Marx.
