Master Aubrey suitably replied in Hebrew and English.

"The Gargoyle."

A diversity of literary and pictorial interest that is even wider than in recent remodelled issues is provided by the new number of "The Gargoyle" which the Vacuum Oil Company has circulated this week. "Oil and Agriculture," its opening article, by J. Skinner Hutton, is a brief historical sketch of the development and rise of South Africa's export trade in agriculturo-pastoral produce, which largely is the history of Bloemfontein and the growth round it of the Free State. It is an entrancing story, which Mr. Skinner tells authoritatively and well. "Natal National Park" is remarkable, particularly for its fine photographic illustrations including the striking cover study of sunlight and shadow on the Drakensberg.
