## THE OPERA HOUSE.

"Seas Beneath."

A new programme will be released at the Opera House to-day and to-morrow. The feature film is "Seas Beneath" with George O'Brien and Marion Lessing in leading parts. "Seas Beneath" is a thrilling mixture of dangerous women spies, courageous men and "mystery ships," while the story lends itself to unusual romance and is apparently very much on he-man lines. On Monday and Tuesday, "Lady for a Day" will be transferred from the Alhambra. On Wednesday and Thursday, Britain's latest screen novelty "Radio Parade" will be released for the first time. This is an all-vaudeville show on a big scale, details of which will be found in the daily Press next week. It is expected that another new release, "Old Dark House" will be next Friday and Saturday's attraction. This is a real thriller and features Boris Karloff and Charles Laughton.

## THE ROYAL.

"Mystery of Mr. X."

"The most mysterious of all mysteries is the one which tells the least," said Edgar Selwyn, director of the new Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer thriller, "Mystery of Mr. X," which opens at the Royal on Monday next.

"This is not a conundrum but a tenet of all mystery story creation. The most dire feeling of dread is instilled by keeping the menace a secret. Horror, no matter what the variety, must be hidden. Its effect is felt, but it must not be seen. This is an iron-clad formula in the creation of eeriness.

"In the new murder-mystery film the horror is known only as 'X,' whose shadow is seen passing over the inert bodies of his victims. The snatch of song he whistles is heard. His living quarters are seen, even part of his shoulder. But not until the final exciting sequence does he appear.

## Capetown Orchestra Activities.

To-morrow evening the Cape Town Orchestra will hold their "Pop" concert in the City Hall. The soloist will be Miss Violet Turnbull who will sing a Romany Song "The Wind on the Heaths" (Lohr) and in the second half "The Little Ships" (Sanderson). The Orchestra will render some delightful numbers such as "Der Fledermaus" (Strauss), the Suite from the Opera "Louise" (Carpentier), "The Passing Regiment" (Oscar Strauss) and "Gipsy Love" (Lehar). Another item on the programme will be songs by the Lyric Male Voice Quartet who will render "In Silent Mead" (Emerson), "Give a man a horse he can ride" (O-Hara), "Fill the Shining Goblet" (Parry) and "Little Boy" (Parks).

On Sunday evening the soloist will be Miss Beth Mitchell. Among the orchestral numbers to be rendered are the Overture

"Le Carneval Romain (Berlioz), Spanish Suite "La Verbena," "The Toy Box" (Englemann), "Largo" (Handel) and "Cavalry Trot" (Rubinstein).

Next Thursday evening Miss Anna Marsh will appear with the Cape Town Orchestra after an absence of eleven years. She will render Schumann's Piano Concerto in A Minor with the Orchestra.
