A real feast of chamber music will be given in the City Hall this evening when the Nelson Trio will appear. These three sisters are exceptionally talented and consist of Anna (pianiste), Ida (violinist) and Zara (cellist). These girls are still in their teens.

The programme will commence with Beethoven's Trio in C minor, followed by the 'Cello Variations on a theme "Rococo" (Tchaikowski), played by Zara, who created a furore at the concert in the City Hall on Monday evening. Anna will play Liszt's Rhapsody No. 11, and Ida will play Vitali's "Chaconne" for Violin. The programme will conclude with Haydn's Trio in D, and a movement from Beethoven's Trio in B Flat.

An excellent concert will be given in the City Hall to-morrow evening when the Forty Young Australians will appear with the Cape Town Municipal Orchestra. Charles Stanton, the ten-year-old conductor, will direct the Orchestra and another of the young Australians will be heard in an organ concerto. This will be their final appearance in Cape Town.

The soloist at the Sunday evening concert will be Miss Stella Blakemore, soprano, and the Municipal Choir will be heard in a specially arranged Carolare programme.

The Orchestra will be on vacation from the 25th June to 19th July inclusive.
