

## IN AND AROUND THE PENINSULA

### *Cape Zionist Youth Executive.*

The twelfth annual Town and Country Parliament was held at the Sea Point Town Hall on Saturday and Sunday under the auspices of the Green and Sea Point Jewish Guild.

On Saturday night a most enjoyable and successful concert, arranged by the Misses R. Schoschen and E. Kossick was produced. This took the form of two plays and a short review, which was much appreciated by the audience present.

Prior to the concert delegates were welcomed by Mr. J. Hanson, the Chairman of the Green and Sea Point Jewish Guild; Mr. A. Sacks, the Chairman of the Green and Sea Point Hebrew Congregation, and Mr. S. M. Levin, the Chairman of the Cape Zionist Youth Executive.

After the concert, caucus meetings were held by the various parties, at the conclusion of which delegates adjourned to the Plaza Cafe, Cape Town, where they were the guests of the Committee of the Green and Sea Point Hebrew Congregation.

On Sunday morning delegates assembled at the Town Hall, and formed themselves into a National Convention, presided over by a chairman. Mr. A. M. Jackson, acting as High Commissioner, then delivered the speech from the Throne. After this, the Convention deliberated on the advisability of having a Legislative Council. The resolution evoked much discussion, and ultimately, after being put to the vote, was carried.

The Convention then formed itself into a Legislative Council, Mr. M. Stokol being speaker; Mr. A. Roberts, Black Rod; Mr. E. Charloff, Prime Minister and Leader of the Arab Party; Mr. S. M. Levin, Leader of the British Officials, and Mr. M. Meyerowitz, Leader of the Jewish Party.

An official luncheon was held at which Mr. A. Hansen presided. Toasts were proposed, amongst others, to the Green and Sea Point Hebrew Congregation, which was replied to in a striking speech by Mr. A. M. Jackson. Special tribute must be paid to Mrs. Wolfe and her helpers, who so ably prepared and arranged the luncheon.

In the afternoon the Immigration and Land Purchase Control Bill and the German and Palestine Reciprocity Bill were introduced and debated. Tea and cake was served during the interval.

At the conclusion of the discussion a Jewish resolution to abolish the Legislative Council was carried.

In the evening a reception to delegates was held at Alphen House, Beach Road, Sea Point. Dancing continued until midnight, when a very successful and enjoyable week-end concluded.

Special tribute must be paid to Mr. J. Hansen, the Chairman of the Green and Sea Point Jewish Guild, and his Committee, and to Mr. A. J. Silber, convenor of the Peninsula Sub-Committee, to whom the success of the function is in no small measure due.

The annual Jewish National Fund Week will be held this year from the 16th to 23rd February. The Executive has arranged several functions for this week which will be held in aid of the fund.

The first of the functions will take place at the Talmud Torah Hall, Wherry Road, Muizenberg, at 8.15 p.m. on Sunday, 16th February. During the first part of the programme, Mr. Lionel Berman will produce a revue, entitled "Something New." The array of talented artists who usually take part in Mr. Berman's productions will participate, and an exceptionally enjoyable show may be expected. Dancing will follow after the revue.

On Wednesday, the 19th February, a J.N.F. Conversazione will be held in the Zionist Hall, Cape Town. All are welcome.

On Sunday, 23rd February, the Executive has arranged a flannel dance at Phillip's Studio, Wellington Fruit Store Building, Longmarket Street.

It is the duty of every Jewish boy and girl to attend these functions.

### *Zionist Conversazione.*

The opening conversazione of the season will take place at the Zionist Hall on Tuesday, 18th inst., at 8.15 p.m. A welcome will be extended to Mr. N. Kirschner, President of the S.A.
