Moiseiwitsch's Concerts.

Those who were amongst the enthusiastic audiences at the second and third concerts given by Moiseiwitsch on Friday, 1st inst., and Monday, 4th inst., respectively, will long cherish the memory of his magnificent playing. The technical skill and superb artistry with which every item on the programme was rendered, held his audiences spell-bound and the thunderous applause which broke out at the close of each item was a well-deserved tribute to a brilliant master of his art.

In programmes which were outstanding from every point of view and which gave the artist tremendous scope, it is difficult to mention any one item in particular. But the Chopin Sonata in B Flat Minor on Friday night and Beethoven's Moonlight Sonata on Monday night were revelations and left a deep and unforgettable impression.

The Moiseiwitsch concerts have certainly made musical history in Cape Town and deep gratitude is due to him for giving so generously of his best.

THE PLAZA.

No matter how much you liked "Naughty Marietta," that musical sensation of 1935, you're sure to like "Rose Marie" even more. Again co-starring Jeanette MacDonald and Nelson Eddy, this Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer production opens on Monday at the Plaza.

THE ROYAL.

The smallest airplane model in the world made its film debut in "Ceiling Zero," the Cosmopolitan production, which comes to the Royal on Monday as a First National release.

It is the property of the builder, Francis Wardall, who furnished more than a hundred miniature airships for scenes in the film starring James Cagney, Pat O'Brien, June Travis and a large cast.

This model is encased in a half-inch glass tube, transfixed to the point of a pin, and is very little larger than the pin-point. Wardall owns the largest miniature plane. It has a wing spread of six feet and is equipped with two electric motors. This latter won him the Jimmy Allen National Trophy last year.
