## Palestinian Securities.

The banking firm Jacob Japhet & Co. Ltd., Jerusalem, has just published a pamphlet on Palestinian Securities in English. This booklet comprises 135 pages, giving a description of 26 companies, Zionist organisations and public bodies.

An institution was created in 1935, whereby a number of banks in Tel-Aviv interested in dealing in securities meet daily in order to fix the quotations for about a dozen securities. These securities and in addition all Palestinian stocks, dealt on foreign stock exchanges, are mentioned in the pamphlet, thereby giving for the first time a complete review of the entire Palestinian security market.

The objects of each single company are closely described and furthermore, details as to the management, capitalisation, assets and liabilities, and the last balance sheet are given, followed by an exact description of the shares and bonds, issued by each company, and its organisation. Besides the issue conditions, other items such as rate of interest, redemption terms, voting rights, etc., are mentioned. Delivery regulations are also described in detail and finally special tables give a survey of the development of the quotations in the course of the last two years.

Considering the remarkable development the security market in Palestine has experienced during the last two years, the pamphlet will undoubtedly be of importance to all parties concerned as a reference book, and further help to develop the growing interest of circles abroad in Palestinian investments.
