

Johannesburg Women's Zionist League.

Nineteenth Annual General Meeting on Tuesday.

The 19th Annual Meeting of the above organisation will be held at the Jewish Guild on Tuesday next, the 14th inst. A report of the year's activities, ending April 30, 1932, has been sent to members. From this it is shown that a year's most excellent work has been carried out by this energetic Zionist body.

Reference is made to the big effort of the League in organising the Carnival for the Redemption of the Sharon. This was a great artistic and financial success and the quota allotted to the ladies was exceeded by over £2,000.

During 1932, the League assisted prominently in organising the Women's Keren Hayesod Campaign. The result to date is £3,750, which has been contributed by 500 donors. This is truly a notable achievement.

The sale of Shekolim was undertaken by the branches of the League resulting in the number of 1,594 being sold. An indication of the work of the organisation is to be seen in the balance sheet, which shows a turnover of £5,695 16s.

The branch system has proved entirely satisfactory and has resulted in the spread of Zionist work throughout the city and the suburbs. Particulars of the accomplishment of work in each branch are given in the report in detail.

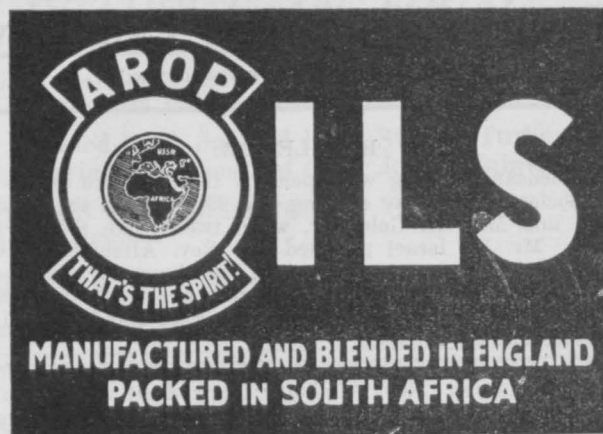
Berele Chagai.
