An Interesting Recital

THERE was a distinguished audience present at the Selborne Hall on Wednesday evening, when an attractive vocal and pianoforte recital took place. The performers were Madame Olga Ryss and Heinz Hirschland.

The former artist has a voice of rich quality, which was heard to great advantage in a programme of songs of considerable variety and language. Some of her seventeenth century items were of particular interest; they are rarely heard on the concert platform in this country. Madame Ryss also sang a number of songs by modern composers, besides giving a delightful variety of Schumann and Tchaikowsky compositions. The singer received a great ovation from a discerning musical audience.

Mr. Hirschland played a nocturne by Chopin, not generally known and which proved rather interesting. He gave a capable performance of the Fantasia in F Minor by Chopin. When rendering the famous Beethoven Sonata in E Major the player showed a lack of modulation. In his other items there was more delicacy of feeling. His playing of "Gavotte and Variations" by J. P. Rameau — an eighteenth century composer — was particularly pleasing.
