SUCCESSFUL SEDER HELD.

Rabbi M. C. Weiler conducted the service which was enjoyed by 150 people. Short remarks were made by J. F. Kapnek (Hon. President of the Congregation and Chairman of the Building Fund); Mr. M. Franks, Chairman of the Executive; Mr. I. Greenberg, on behalf of the Hasmonians; and Mrs. M. Franks, Chairlady of the Sisterhood.

The choir of the Congregation assisted ably and led the singing throughout the evening.

**A South African Colony  
in Palestine ?**

The amount of £20 was collected by Mr. Joe Penn on the occasion of the Barmitzvah of Master Solomon, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. Penn, which took place on June 7, 1935, in order to inscribe the Barmitzvah in the Golden Book. The amount was contributed by the parents, relatives and friends of the Barmitzvah.

The Bris Milah of Ronald Leon, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Wunsh took place on March 31, 1936. Advantage was taken of this occasion by Mr. J. Penn to collect the sum of £20 from the parents, relatives and friends in order to inscribe Master Ronald Leon Wunsh in the Golden Book.

In the course of a toast proposed by Dr. Balkin, he suggested that the time had arrived for a South African colony to be founded in Eretz Israel for South African Jews. His suggestion was seconded by Mr. Kalmanson. The scheme is still to be crystallised and will be submitted in due course to the proper authorities for their consideration. Meanwhile, however, those present spontaneously pledged themselves to contribute generously towards it, the first donation of £1 being made in the name of the Bris Milah and £1 1s. also being donated by Basil Wunsh.
