Lecture by Mr. Edgar Bernstein.

A meeting of an intensely interesting nature took place at Mrs. Broomberg's residence in Parktown, when Mr. Edgar Bernstein addressed the Israel Zangwill Group on "Wasserman" — whom he called the Jewish Dostoievsky. The speaker painted with dramatic force the life of Wasserman, its loneliness, its unhappiness, its intense quality. He adumbrated the problems which beset him, in his relations to humanity as man, as German, as Jew, and correlated this sketch with the incidents, characters and sweep of Wasserman's books.

The lecturer's deeply sympathetic treatment of his subject, his talent for getting under the skin of his subject, which made him approach it with a feeling of reverence, was communicated to his audience. Mr. Bernstein showed that the writings of Wasserman are as cross-sections of life. He piles event upon event, seemingly unrelated threads are introduced, later to be woven together into a tremendous pattern to which however there is no end, no conclusion. In this refusal to define ultimate issues, the lecturer sees the breadth of vision and depth of thinking of Wasserman. After a brief discussion of a few of his books, and provocative replies to a number of well-directed queries, the gathering broke up—those who had not read Wasserman inspired to do se, and those who had, to read him again in the light of a new understanding.

At the next meeting of this group Dr. Syngalowski will speak on the Ort-Oze in Yiddish.
