Jews Who Fell in the War.

MEMORIAL service was held in front of the plaque erected in the Jewish Guild Hall in Johannesburg to perpetuate the memory of the South African Jews who fell in the Great War. This ceremony is an annual event taking place on the Sunday before the Day of Atonement.

Members of the S.A. Ex-Service League, Imperial Light Horse and Legion of Fron-tiersmen paraded under the command of Captain M. Summerfield.

Rev. Dr. A. T. Shrock delivered a stirring speech, stressing the reason for assembling to offer up a prayer for the repose of the souls of Jews who lost their lives during the terrible conflict of 1914 to 1918.

"Let us not think that the sacrifice of those who gave their lives for their King and country has been in vain," declared Dr. Shrock.

After the address, Captain Summerfield placed a wreath below the memorial tablet and the ceremony ended with the singing of "God Save the King."
