The Days Pass.

THE days are passing in Shanghai, that town about which people abroad read wonderful tales, that town which is so large and so small, that town of the most obtrusive, most dirty Chinese beggars and of the most egotistical, most wealthy Chinese capitalists, of the most poor rickshaw coolies and of the most inexorable policemen, that town which will never be quite intimate to you, which you hate and which, however, always attracts you again.

The days are passing in inactivity because an artist here has to be behind the amateurs. You have got a lot of ideas and plans; you want to work. You dream your old dream of educating jobless colleagues and young authors for a new artistical activity in the proper way. That way, which you couldn't follow any more in Germany because of your being a Jew. But that way may become a new theme of working in New York.

But you are condemned to inactivity without an affidavit. Every country must be a reversed prison, because her own nationals should be considered first and, of course, you cannot blame them.

Never will we give up our hopes, however. We shall not be lost as human beings and as artists in this city. It cannot be; it will not be. And it is that thought which supports us, that all over the world talent and spirit, which give the power to bear up, will get final success.

If life runs on always without resistance and never brings hard and bad times, then it is not worthwhile. Always again it is the fight for the future which makes us forget the ruins of the time past. And only strong will can lead us to victory!
